Each year we must try to embark on this journey as if for the



first time, hearing it better, understanding it more deeply, and making it more our own. On this First

Sunday of Advent the readings look at the ultimate goal of the journey, namely, the Second coming of Christ, He whom we Christians show to the world by our faith, hope and love.

Outside the Hermitage on Mt. Subasio, we walk through the forest by the caves which Francis and his Franciscan brothers visited from time to time for meditation and prayer; at times accompanied with singing birds. Silence is present everywhere and the spirit of Francis as well. We walk in silence thinking

our own thoughts, reflecting on our own lives and improving our own faith. The path takes us to the back of the mountain to a beautiful outdoor chapel. We sit in silence letting our souls reflect. I share with everyone just a few points about soul searching. Our soul by its own nature searches for its own path. best friend on this journey is silence because silence is where we might participate in the most important conversation with

God and our own self. Silence defines our very character. Listening is an act of communication. Souls that are ready to listen find wisdom. Francesco teaches us that we have to do this in order to understand ourselves. Silence taught him and teaches us three important fundamentals of our spirituality - humility, unselfishness, and service. Our spiritual needs require time, silence and reflection so that we may obtain wisdom and virtue to live our days happily in order to serve as an inspiration to others.

We walk back to the beautiful Hermitage chapel for a Mass of Thanksgiving. During the Mass we pray for and express our thanks for the people in our lives, gifts given to us those in our families, our parish and our church. It is important to give thanks to the Giver for his gifts. At the Mass, I give thanks for the people of St. Jerome and the time that we have spent together during the last 16 years. We try to imagine how our life would be quite different if it weren't for the gift of meeting each other. At the end of the Mass, Joanne reads the Canticle of the

> Sun, a beautiful poem written by St. Francis just before he died. Today is the 11th day of October, the beginning of the Year of Faith proclaimed by Pope Benedict today at the Vatican. We reflect on the importance of this beautiful gift.

> The shuttle buses take us

back through the most beautiful hills of Umbria through different gates. We return by way of the Basilica of St. Francis to our Hotel Fontabella.

Time to relax, get good Italian coffee, hear people's reflections and wait for dinner. I make a few updates of our Facebook page. I hope you enjoy reading this as much as we enjoyed walking through these places that opened our eyes anew.




cial Mass. There will be refreshments afterward. No 9:30 or 11 a.m. Masses that day, but there will be the usual 7:30 a.m. Mass.

A Little Bit of St. Jerome Church History

In the 1970s St. Jerome Church underwent a "make over." Fr. Mark



Kozina was our pastor at the time. The Sanctuary was so strikingly different, it caused much controversy. There were roughly 40 red mosaic pieces on the Sanctuary's back wall. Some parishioners called them "tongues of fire," "red birds," and the more pious called them "symbols of the Holy Spirit." The description that gave Fr. Mark the biggest chuckle was "boomerangs." More significant is that they once hung proudly in our beloved St. Jerome Church.
