Nonetheless, Jesus urged Jairus to have faith. Jesus went into the child's room and said to her, "Arise!" Immediately the little girl got up.

Our Parish History / Through Our Stories

Memories connected to St. Jerome's... let's start at the beginning...

My late father, Ivan Pavić, left his homeland Croatia in 1944 ahead of the communist partisans who were occupy-


ing the land. He fled to Austria. He was never allowed nor did he ever return to his country. The communist regime did not even allow his earthly remains to be transported to Croatia to be buried in the village where both my parents are from, Rašeljke, in the county of Tomislavgrad, where he had had erected a family tombstone. It was his wish that even if it remained empty, it would serve as a marker that the family was once there....

In 1950, Catholic Charities paid for his trip across the ocean to the United States, to New Orleans specifically. He paid back the fare by working as the caretaker of the cemetery of a small church for 6 months. Thereafter, a social worker arranged for him to move to Chicago where a Croatian community existed. That's how he came to Bridgeport and to our parish, St. Jerome's.

During this time period, the communists did not allow my mother, Kata Pavić, my brother, Peter, and my sister, Jela (Helen Kutleša) to leave the oppressive state of Yugoslavia. My family members were forcibly separated for 18 years (20 for Peter who had to complete service in the army)!

All those years, my father worked hard and provided for his family, sending them packages of all kinds. The late Fr. Ferdinand Skoko, pastor at the time, helped him per-

sonally so much and in so many ways. He, along with some other parishioners, used to write his letters to my mother because my dad only knew how to sign his name.

When my mother and Helen came to America in 1962, it was time for a new beginning. Finally going to be with "her John," my mother had one big concern: how was she going to attend Mass and understand anything. She always recalls the first time she

came to church at St. Jerome's and heard Mass in her Croatian language: She felt as though the sun shined down directly upon her! She was so thankful to God.

At that time, the late Fr. Mark Kozina was holding English classes for newcomers in the school, which my mom and sister took. They say that after a few weeks, Fr. Mark asked people to speak up and say what they had learned. One lady raised her hand and said, "OK!".

My parents were faithful to one another, to their marriage all throughout their 18 years of forced separation which had followed only 5 years of marriage, 3 of which were in the middle of wartime. God rewarded them by giving them another child in their later years (me) as well as 21 years of life together until my father's death in 1983. His funeral Mass was at St. Jerome's, concelebrated by 7 of our Franciscan priests. The main celebrant was the late Fr. Hrvoslav Ban (the associate pastor) joined by the late Fr. Jerry Kučan (pastor), by Fr. Častimir (Tim) Majić and Fr. Paul Maslać and deceased Fathers Gracijan Raspudić, Serafin Vištica and David Zrno.
