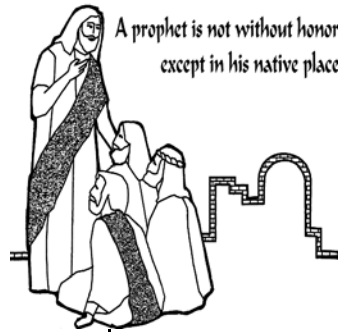

WEEKLY MEDITATION for the 14th Sunday of the Year

It is a challenge to accept the reality that another person is better than us in some way. When someone succeeds in life, rising above the ordinary, we may praise and esteem that person, but envy also can be tugging at our hearts. Often the person who is envied becomes the innocent victim of gossip and even lies. It must be especially bitterly hard to be an innocent victim of envy from those who you grew up with. Jesus was such a victim in today's Gospel reading.

Jesus returned to his hometown of Nazareth, where he had spent most of his earthly life. He had recently been helping many sick people in a miraculous way, and he had spoken several amazing sermons with great authority. "Where did this man get all this?" wondered the people of his hometown. "Is he not the carpenter, the son of Mary?" They were amazed but also jealous.



Indeed they closed their hearts to all the good that they heard he had been doing for others. They chose to not believe in him, but instead demanded signs and miracles.

Their unbelief grieved Jesus.

May we who have faith in Jesus not grieve him through envy and gossip.

Our Parish History / Through Our Stories

A family's memories of the early years of St. Jerome's

The 100th Anniversary of St. Jerome's is also the 100th Anniversary of the arrival of my parents, Ivan & Sima (Pralac) Dujmović from Hercegovina to Chicago in April 1912.

They lived across the street from St. Jerome's, and were good friends with Fr. Leon Medic, the first pastor.

My mother's cousin, Fr. Franjo Cuturec, was pastor of St. Jerome's from 1936 to 1943. I remember Father visiting our family quite often.

My parents noticed that, at that time, many at St. Jerome's knew nothing about Croatian history, or even who they were. My mother said that some people made fun of them for being "Croatian." Those people would say to them "Mi smo Dalmatinci," or "We are Dalmatians."

My parents said it was our Franciscans who would teach people about who they were.

Our people from Bosnia & Hercegovina knew who they were, in spite of 400 years of Turkish rule!

After few years at St. Jerome's, my parents moved to southwest side, and became members of Sacred Heart Church.

My sister and I attended the 100th Anniversary dinner. It was wonderful celebration. The dinner, films and program were outstanding. It was great to see, I believe, over a thousand people!
