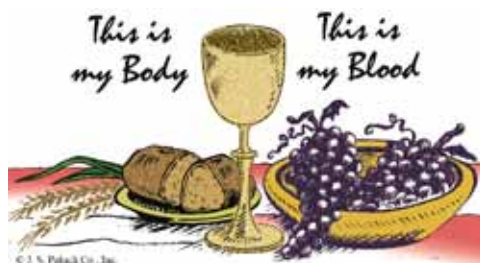
## WEEKLY MEDITATION FOR CORPUS CHRISTI

Today is the Feast of Corpus Christi, the Body of Christ. The Eucharist celebrates a loving event. It is the sacrificial gift Jesus made of his life on our behalf. Every time we celebrate the Eucharist we enter into that again. In the Eucharist Jesus nourishes us with the bread of life, but it's not meant to be one-way traffic. Hav-

ing received from Jesus, we are expected to give something in return to one another.

This means unselfish giving of oneself in the service of others.

The Eucharist is the meal that we share in the Lord's memory and at



his command. By inviting us to partake of the sacred food of the Eucharist, Jesus makes us his compan-

ions. In so doing we are to become companions to one another. Jesus gives himself to us so that we may give ourselves to others.

## Our Parish History / Through Our Stories

### 'What did I tell you?'

In 1952, kindergarten was in the front parlor of the old convent—the convent prior to the present one. I was left-handed and my teacher was the dear Sr. Lucille. She felt that it was not acceptable to be left-handed, so I spent all of my kindergarten year with my left hand tied to the chair behind my back.

I have beautiful penmanship and I am able to write in several different calligraphy scripts, all with my right hand. Everything else I do left-handed.

Fast forward to the 1990s. I was in the hospital having a knee replacement and Sr. Lucille was in the room across the hall. One night the nurses came into my room and told me that Sister was not doing very well. They asked me if I would mind sitting with her until the other Sisters arrived. Of course I said yes, and they wheeled me across the hall to sit with Sister. Here is the conversation to the best of my memory.

"Hello, Sister. Do you remember me?" She looked very intently and said, "Yes, of course I remember you." After a little chit chat I said, "Sister, would you like to say the Rosary?" She answered, "Oh yes, I would."



I proceeded to go into the pocket of my robe to get my rosary. She looked at me and said, "Patricia, what did I tell you about that left hand?" Sister went to her eternal reward not long after that.

A second remembrance about St. Jerome's

My second grade (1954) teacher was Sr. Valeria. She was a young girl and quite beautiful. In fact, she had the face and the voice of an angel. The second grade room was next to the sacristy, so a certain decorum was to be adhered to in the classroom. Sister was our instructor for First Holy Communion. She made an everlasting impression on me. Today I am a Eucharistic minister and the guardian of the altar servers at my church. Fast forward to 2012. Sister Valerie and I are pen pals!
