



WEEKLY MEDITATION for the Feast of St. John the Baptist

St. John the Baptist is a unique biblical figure. Prophet, messenger, desert man, powerful orator ... His name John, in Hebrew, means "the LORD is merciful." His feast is the sign of new beginnings. It is different from other saints, whose feast days mark the time when they died. St. John is the only holy person, besides the Blessed Mother and, of course, Jesus, whose birthday we celebrate. John was the sign of new times, a new coming, a new testament. A simple man from the Judean desert who shook Jerusalem and the powerful were afraid of him so much so that the King had him killed. Powerful words of prophecy against powerful politics. And John won. It is still the same today. Truth will triumph in the end. A powerful voice could never be silenced because the truth is the real



power. John stands today as the sign and an invitation to all those who speak the truth not to be afraid, to all those who follow Christ not to be frightened, to all those who do not go by the majority's opinion but by the Truth!

Our Parish History / Through Our Stories

The Warmth of St. Jerome's

My first contact with St. Jerome's and the Croatian diaspora here was in the fall of 1984. Marrying Visnja Uremovic, I be-

gan to be acquainted with the new culture of the people who live here in the U.S, and the Croatian immigrants. It was very interesting and somewhat of an adventure at my young age to observe the Croatian-American society. At the same time I was curious and interested to listen, to learn how to work, of course to earn a comfortable living.

My first memory of contact with St. Jerome's parish was through marriage preparation with Fr. Hrvoslav Ban. Because I had lived in Zagreb before coming to the U.S., Fr. Hrvoslav left his mark on me not only as a good priest but also as a very refined man. I learned he was a writer, and I even received some of his works. Like a raw newcomer, I tried to compare life in what was then called "Yugoslavia" and my new surroundings. I would compare things here with Tresnjevka (a neighborhood in Zagreb), and St. Joseph Church, where I received First Communion and Confirmation. I can definitely say that I felt much more closeness and warmth at St. Jerome's from the beginning, as well as now. I



especially enjoyed parish events, such as the concerts of the Cardinal Stepinac folklore group, Croatian Masses, the celebrations of Velika Gospa, Christmas, Easter and Cardinal Stepinac's feast days. I have fond memories of numerous good homilies which led me into deep reflection and discoveries within myself. I remem-

ber Fr. Hrvoslav's baptizing our sons Philip and Peter.

Fr. Marko Kozina, Fr. Marko Puljic, Fr. Joe and Fr. Ivan have often had instructive and formative messages that did not leave me unmoved. Remembrances of Cardinal Stepinac and readings about Croatian priest martyrs would leave me choked up. My memories of socializing with St. Jerome's people was always interesting, but I particularly recall with thanksgiving the Paraga family — Ivanka invited me to consider becoming a Eucharistic Minister, and Fr. Joe installed me in that ministry. These are my recollections — thank you to all the priests whom I didn't mention in these few lines. It is beautiful to be surrounded by people who spread faith and goodness.
