Dear Friends of St. Jerome,

On April 15th 2012 my life was changed forever. I suffered a health event that at times looked like it might take my life. Sobering to say the least, especially when, as most of us, all we want in life is to take care of our families and continue to keep moving forward. Keep building the positives that we all push for every day.

Many years ago in Oakland, California while living with my single mother after years of turmoil from divorce, I sat alone and begged God to lead me to a family, a wife and children, that would be my ideal. That would replace the upheaval that I had been through. He led me to my wife Ro, and my two beautiful children, Rianna and Marissa. My fortune from God was overwhelming because without my wife I might not survive this ordeal. My children are my life, the reason I live. She fought for her family, she did everything that I begged for that night in Oakland and then went above. I owe her my life. Period. I cannot tell you how much I love her and appreciate God making her my wife.

My children, they were strong and kept their dignity. They loved each other and proved once again God's hand in their being in my life. They were unbelievable. A function of their mother. God came through again my family is exactly what I begged for and I am so grateful. My love for them is endless. God's gift of my family is truly appreciated.

I can never thank you all enough. I can never erase the pain I've caused. All I can do is live the way Christ would want me to so that I can protect the beautiful family He gave me. From the bottom of my heart to ALL in our parish, thank you, I hope God blesses you, and I hope Christ blesses you like he did my family.
