Weekly Meditation for the Fifth Sunday of Easter

Christ wrote no books nor left buildings or monuments behind. He did something far greater and more necessary. He built a community, a church. That was his gift to us.

He said, "I am the vine, you are the branches." This was the image he used in talking about

the community he founded. It is a simple but profound illustration of unity, closeness and interdependence.

Just as the branches need the vine, so we need Christ. Separated from him, we are unable to bear fruit. But the vine also needs the branches — the

branches are where the fruit is produced. Christ depends on us to produce fruit in the world. He didn't ask us to be successful, but to be fruitful. What is important is to love. God will make our love fruitful.

We are the branches of the True Vine.

Our Parish History / Through Our Stories

Attending Mass in the 1960s and 1970s

St. Jerome's has been a significant part of my life since childhood and has blessed me in numerous unexpected ways, including providing me an appreciation for culture and music, discipline, community and spiritual direction. Here are just a couple of my fondest memories.

As a student at St. Jerome's in the 1960s, my school day always started with Mass. All the students sat with their class and with the nun who was assigned to that grade. The youngest to the oldest students behaved in church — either out of the fear of God, the nuns or our parents. We were also required to attend the Sunday Mass assigned the school children and sit with our class. Occasionally, during the week, we would have to stay after Mass to learn new songs or practice processing into the church for special occasions. We had to practice over and over until it was done to the satisfaction of the nuns, who would let us know how we were doing by clapping their hands or snapping the rubber-band-

bound prayer books. The entire school sang those songs, maybe not in perfect pitch, but you knew them. I attribute my appreciation for music to those practice sessions.

My parents required us to attend Mass every Sunday, without exception, in addition to some special services, such as Holy Saturday. In spite of my parents' busy life raising five children, they always set an example and attended Mass with us. My parents explained that we demonstrate our belief in God by going to church. I have to admit I wasn't always happy

about that but went anyway. As a young adult, after graduating from St. Jerome's, I could honestly say I never missed a Sunday Mass and never wanted to. All those years of training gave me the discipline not only to attend Sunday Mass, but the desire to join the devotions to St. Anthony and our Gospa Sinjska.

I attended Midnight Mass with my Mom and sister on Christmas Eve 1975. The church was filled to capacity and we were sitting in the balcony close to the choir on the Blessed Mother's There side. were some friends around us and we were all very happy. When I looked around the church to see all the

people, I spotted one very interesting looking man looking at me. He was standing on the top row of the balcony almost opposite of where we were. After the Mass ended, while everyone was extending Christmas greetings, I looked for him to wish him a Merry Christmas. I found him standing in the vestibule, leaning on the wall, probably waiting for me too. We had our first date shortly after that greeting and on Dec. 13, 1980, we were married.
