## WEEKLY MEDITATION for the 33rd Sunday of Ordinary Time

Jesus says, "Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away." The words of Jesus remain with us to this very day, guiding us, challenging us.

They can turn our worldly values upside down. Once heard, they can never be forgotten, but for all that, they will benefit us little unless we act on them. They are like precious seeds. If left in a jar, they remain just so many seeds, but if they are taken out and planted, they produce a rich harvest.

In comparison with faith, there is nothing sure or lasting in the world. Public opinion is rooted in appearances and changes from day to day, but the words of Jesus do not change or pass away.

Faith gives us the conviction that the world is not ultimately heading toward catastrophe. The world as we know it is headed toward fulfillment in Christ.

St. Jerome's Centennial Pilgrimage to Assisi & Rome, Oct. 8-18, 2012



#### DAY 2 - Wednesday, Oct. 10 -Assisi

On Palm Sunday in 1211, in this church that we are visiting, the church the Porziuncola, St. Francis received Clare of Assisi and dedicated her to the Lord. The General Chapters, the annual meetings of all the friars, were held in this church, usually during Pentecost.

Feeling his end approaching, St. Francis asked to be brought back to the Porziuncola in September 1226. On his death-bed, St. Francis recommended the chapel to the faithful protection and care of his brethren. He died, in his cell, not fifteen yards from the church, at sunset on Saturday, October 3, 1226.

This is the cradle of the Franciscan Order. After the death of Francis, the spiritual value and the charisma of the little church of the Porziuncola became even greater. St. Francis himself pointed out the Porziuncola as a primary source of inspiration and a model for all his follow-

ers. Today, it still continues to be a most authentic testimony to the life and message of St. Francis.

A large church was built around this small church, named Basilica of St. Mary of the Angels.

In one of the hallways by the Basilica there is an interesting statue of St. Francis. Remember that he is a man of peace, a saintly figure of our Christian faith. This particular statue is interesting because Francis holds in his hands a basket. Everyday, two doves come

finding their own dwelling place among his hands. Amazing! In our short video posted on our web site you can see how still the doves are – like a statue.

We took a break for about an hour or so and agreed to meet at 1:45 p.m. in front of the Basilica. Everybody came on time, but our Franciscan brother, Fr. Ivan. We were waiting...and waiting...and waiting. We couldn't believe that as a Franciscan, he got lost in *Assisi* of all places. Finally, here he comes. The story goes...Fr. Ivan went inside the church to pray and then when the Italian Franciscans took their siesta, they locked up the basilica and left, so Fr. Ivan was locked in... but in the end it was a happy ending: We were waiting for him while he prayed for us... not a bad deal.

#### DAY 3 - Thursday, October 11 - Assisi

Our day started at the Franciscan Sanctuary of Rivotorto. Rivotorto is an important part of the Assisi experience. It lies in the plain at the foot of Mount Subiaso, about a mile east of Assisi's center. This Franciscan Sanctuary in Rivotorto, guards the "sacro Tugurio" (the Sacred Hut) in which the Friars first lived at the beginnings of the Order. It also holds the memory of some of the earliest episodes of St. Francis' spiritual journey and of the newly born Franciscan Order. The words "HIC PRI-MORDIA FRATRUM MINORUM" (Here began the

Friar Minors) are inscribed on the stone over the main entrance of the Sanctuary. Rivotorto takes us back to the origins of the Franciscan brotherhood when, as St. Francis said, "the Lord gave me brothers." Here, Francis went through an initial period of solitude and then eventually, he shared this place with his brothers: Bernardo, Peter, Giles, Sabbatino, Morico and others (1208-1211).
