WEEKLY MEDITATION for the 24th Sunday of Ordinary Time

Peter declares his faith in Jesus as the Messiah. He got the *identity* of Jesus absolutely right. His faith was perfect as far as words went. But when the time came for action, he was woefully lacking. When Jesus asked him to watch with him during his agony in the garden, Peter fell asleep. And later that night Peter denied that he had ever

known Jesus.

Sometimes faith consists only in words. But there is faith that flows into deeds. We need God's grace, not only to profess our faith, but also to live it.

Peter never let any of these failures stop him from trying to follow Jesus. And Peter eventually succeeded in spreading the Good News of Jesus. Just like Peter, we all seem to mess things up at times. We make bad decisions. We neglect to learn our faith and understand it deeply. Thank God that Jesus is patient with us, and never gives up on us. He and his church let us know what is wrong, but he and his church want us to keep going till we walk the way of Jesus.

We continue our journey through our Jubilee Year. Besides events being held this year to mark this special Jubilee, it is important to grow in wisdom as a community,

to be open to teaching, to advancing our spiritual life. I would love to share with you a letter I received from one of our longtime parish friends:

My mother, Carmela Radun Perno, passed away on June 22, 2012. Her family was connected to St. Jerome throughout her childhood. Here is the snapshot of her story. In the early 1920s, my grandparents came to the United States from Slatine, near Split, and settled in St. Jerome's Parish. Like all of their friends and neighbors, they came with no material wealth, but with abundance of what matters most-hopes, dreams and faith. The Church and Dalmatian community were extremely important to my grandmother, Frances Domic Radun. When my grandfather Marko Radun died in an industrial accident in 1933, she was left to raise three young children. With no family in America, no job or training, speaking virtually no English, and heartbroken over her loss, the church and community gave her strength to persevere and



raise her children. My mother was particularly close to her father and suffered a profound loss when he died just two months before her 8th birthday. He taught my mother everything she valued - how to read and write, how to tie her shoes, how to make hats and boats from sheets of paper, and how to pray. Faith became an integral part of my

mother's world. While my mother and her family eventually moved out of St. Jerome parish, the church and community remained an important part of our family heritage. I looked forward to special visits to aging Tete's and Kuma's in the "old neighborhood" and the annual trip to Velika Gospa. *Jacquie Perno*
