1ST SUNDAY OF LENT

The Gospel's message rings out loud and clear. Jesus challenges us to address our deeper hungers and greater needs. In a world with no guidance, no encouragement, no affirmation, no consolation and never a word to communicate peace and welcome or love and joy, the body would be nourished but its heart and soul would be empty. We are God's children. We need to hear God's word.

Bread alone will not always guarantee even the physical survival. The poet Irina Ratushinkaya spent some time in prison as a political prisoner in Communist Soviet Union. She said, "Many women had more bread than I had, yet they died." What was it that kept her alive? She has no doubt that it was her Christian faith. It is not just the human body that gets hungry. The human heart and the human spirit get hungry too. Until we acknowledge and address the hunger of the heart and the spirit, we will always be undernourished. Jesus challenges us to address our deeper hungers and greater needs. For what does the heart really hunger? It is certainly not bread. It hungers for the food that doesn't perish the Word of God which has the power to nourish us. It nourishes us with meaning, hope, and above all love.

Temptations are never a once in a while affair. They return at opportune times. Temptations continued through Jesus' life as the tempter sought in vain to undermine His mission. Even as He hung on the cross we hear an echo of the second temptation: 'If He is the Messiah, let Him come down from the cross and we will believe in Him.' All who are struggling to live a good life can take heart. Resisting temptation will not be easy, but in Jesus we have a brother who knows what we are up against. He forgives us, enables us to obey God's word, to trust Him and to worship Him alone.

THE RESIGNATION OF POPE BENEDICT XVI

On February 11, 2013, the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, Pope Benedict XVI informed the Consistory of Cardinals and communicated to the world his decision to retire from the Pontificate.

The Pope's retirement statement does not come to us as a surprise. For those who have been listening the pope's announcements over the past two years, he has repeatedly affirmed that "unless my health does not improve, I may consider retiring from the papacy." Pope Benedict XVI, in a publication in 2010, "Light of the World", openly stated that if a pope is no longer "physically, psychologically and spiritually able to carry out the obligations of his office, then he has the right and, in some circumstances, even the obligation to retire."

Let us recall that papal resignation had been in the air for almost a decade before Pope John Paul II's death at 84, as the pontiff had been visibly weakened from Parkinson's disease and hip and knee ailments. In the last years, his speech had been slurred and he used a throne on wheels that was pushed by aides.

Admittedly, John Paul II after considering retiring, considered it best "for him" to stay on as long as God wanted, even if that meant no longer being able to personally tend to important ecclesiastical and world issues, but instead offer up his sufferings and digressive health conditions for the good of the Church. However, the same may not be said for Pope Benedict XVI, whose exceptional situation has chosen made him decide that the will of God "for him" is to allow a successor with more vigor and mental clarity to effectively tend to pressing and grave world issues that threaten the planet and our very existence.

The renunciation of papal office is not, in itself, a cause for scandal. It is foreseen in the Code of Canon Law, and it is historically verified throughout the centuries. The official reason is crafted in his own words of February 11. He stated before the College of Cardinals: "I am well aware that this ministry, due to its essential spiritual nature, must be carried out not only by words and deeds but no less with prayer and suffering. However, in today's world, subject to so many rapid changes and shaken by questions of deep relevance for



the life of faith, in order to govern the barque of St. Peter and proclaim the Gospel, both strength of mind and body are necessary - strengths which in the last few months, has deteriorated in me to the extent that I have had to recognize my incapacity to adequately fulfill the ministry entrusted to me."

LENTEN FAST AND ABSTINENCE

The age of fasting is from the completion of the 18th year to the beginning of the 60th. It is allowed to substitute with some other form of penance for abstinence on all of the Fridays of the year, except for those Fridays in Lent. Thus, the rules for fasting and abstinence iare:

- Every person 14 years of age or older must abstain from meat on <u>Ash Wednesday</u>, <u>Good Friday</u>, and all the Fridays of <u>Lent</u>.

- Every person between the age of 18 and 60 must fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

- Every person 14 years of age or older must abstain from meat on all other Fridays of the year, unless he or she substitutes some other form of penance for abstinence.
