WEEKLY MEDITATION for the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

In attempting to describe the *relationship* between God and his people, the Bible uses the image of a bridegroom and his bride. In describing the *joy* God finds among his people, it uses the image of a wedding feast.

What Jesus did at Cana was not a one of a kind thing. It

pointed to what would happen all through his ministry. The changing of water into wine illustrated what he was about. Everywhere Jesus went, the old was made new. His presence could change beyond recognition the lives of those with whom he came into contact, and Jesus continues to

do this for those who believe in him and follow him.

The wedding servants were just Jesus' agents. They drew servings from the water Jesus had turned into wine and gave them to the guests. We draw from the same source: Jesus. From his fullness we continue to receive and to share.
