WEEKLY MEDITATION — Passion (Palm) Sunday

This year on Palm Sunday the Church reads an entire account of the Passion of Jesus as recorded by St. Luke. There are many characters in this story of suffering, but the focus is on Jesus. Contrasting with the evil and darkness of the passion account, Christ's goodness shines. The day of his death is not called "Bad Friday" but "Good Friday." What makes it good is the self-sacrificing love of Jesus. It is the love that we are remembering this week.

On the surface it could seem as if Christ's passion and death was a defeat, yet we know it was truly a victory. It was the triumph of Jesus over the Devil, of good over evil, of love over hate, of light over darkness, of life over death.

Jesus responded to what was done to him by absorbing the violence and death, transforming it, and returning it as love and forgiveness. This was the victory of love over all the powers of destruction. There was

nothing but love in him. Even when they nailed his hands and feet, he was loving. It helps to think about that when we are going through hard times. It is a consolation for us to know that Jesus suffered as we do.

But it is also important to recall that if we love, we will suffer, especially when we are called to self-sacrificing love. Love inevitably brings pain, but also great joy. The Christian must not only accept suffering; he must make it holy. Love makes it holy!

WISDOM'S CORNER

Where the fire has been

Pioneers were making their way across one of the central states to a distant place that had been opened up for homesteading. They traveled in covered wagons drawn by oxen, and progress was very slow. One day they were horrified to see a long line of smoke in the west, stretching for miles across the prairie. Soon it was clear that the dried grass was burning fiercely and the fire was coming toward them rapidly. They had crossed a river the day before, but it would be impossible to go back to it before the flames would be upon them.

Only one man seemed to understand what should be done. He gave the command to set fire to the grass behind them. Then when a space was burned over, the whole company moved back upon it. As the flames roared on toward them from the west, a little girl cried out in terror: "Are you sure we shall not all be burned?"

On Palm Sunday, and especially on Good Friday, we remember how Jesus took upon himself all our sins. All who repent and seek forgiveness for their sins (including the Sacrament of Confession for serious sins) will not be touched by the fire.
