WEEKLY MEDITATION 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jesus said to His disciples, "Unless you take up your cross and follow Me you cannot be my disciple." The 'cross' doesn't mean your arthritis, your indigestion, or that difficult relationship, at least not in the first place. These are things that come to us in spite of ourselves. The 'cross' in the New Testament means the suffering that comes into our lives because of the choices we have made for the Kingdom. In that sense it is always something we choose. For many, religion is just a crutch — something to lean on in times of weakness or infirmity, but in times of wellbeing they more or less forget about it. It is true that faith is the best support we can have in times of weakness, but it is a lot more. It should be a posititive force in our lives. It is a crutch in times of sadness and weakness, but it should be a pair of wings in times of joy and strength. There is a religion of devotion, and a religion of commitment — a religion of comfort and self-concern, and a religion of challenge and unselfishness. Jesus asks for commitment from His followers. Being a disciple is serious business. What does following Christ mean in practice? It means faithfulness to one's way of life and concern for others in whatever manner possible. Our following of Christ can be in small steps, one decision at a time. Love will enable us to turn the crosses in life from stumbling blocks into stepping stones. God is patient. His challenge is actually an invitation.

Use this guideline: When deciding what to wear to church, think about this. If it's something you would wear to a picnic, to play a sport, or to do cleaning, don't wear it to church, even during the summer.


