# WEEKLY MEDITATION for the 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jesus said to his disciples, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up the cross, and follow me."

"The cross" doesn't primarily mean our arthritis, our indigestion, or a difficult relationship that we have — though those can be secondary instances of our cross. The primary meaning of "the cross" in the New Testament is the suffering that comes into our lives because of the choices we

have made due to our following Jesus.

Love enables us to turn the cross from a potential stumbling block into a stepping stone. What Jesus did for us on his Cross was an expression of his love for us and for the Father.

In the Gospel Jesus asks for commitment from his followers. For the committed Christian, suffering is not a likelihood; it is a certainty. Being a disciple is a serious business. But we don't carry our cross by ourselves.



Jesus supports all those who follow him down the narrow road of sacrifice, and shares his Easter victory with them!

# Losing and gaining

The Vietnamese Catholics are no strangers to persecution. They suffered one of the worst in the history of the missions. Between 1857 and 1862, pagan rulers executed 115 of the 300 native priests, 100 Vietnamese nuns, and 5,000 faithful. Another 40,000 Catholics died of starvation after their villages and crops were burned. In another wave of persecution, from 1883 to 1885, 18 native priests, 270 nuns, and 38,000 lay Catholics were killed.

The Communist Vietnamese took control of North Vietnam in April 1952. Thousands of Catholics left their houses, fields and villages of their forefathers and sought evacuation to South Vietnam because under the Communists' "Democratic Republic of Vietnam." Catholics did not have freedom of religion. They gave up all their possessions, except what they could carry, and that included their greatest treasure — the faith they carried in their hearts.
