WEEKLY MEDITATION for the 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In the Gospel Jesus gives us some instructions regarding the journey of life. He tells us to be prepared for the unexpected. Like faithful servants, we should keep ourselves in a state of readiness—not in fear, but in trust and hope.

As life goes on, we become increasingly aware of how fleeting life is, and how precarious is the hold we have on it. Life can be taken away from us in the twinkling of an eye. The brevity and fragility of life bring home

to us how precious is the treasure that we carry in earthen vessels.

Jesus is fully aware of this uncertainty of life. His parable after all stresses the fact that death can come at any moment. However, the

uncertainty of life should not prevent us from being joyful in the present.

Every one of us would like to be able to complete our life on earth with



our plans carried out and our work done, but we may not know if we'll have that chance. What we do have is an opportunity to be faithful to our responsibilities and commitments on a

daily basis, like the servant Jesus spoke about in the parable. Then we can go forward into the unknown, trusting in God's gracious and loving care.
