WEEKLY MEDITATION — Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Elijah was the greatest of the Old Testament prophets; even so, in today's reading he lost his spirit. Jesus himself faced such an experience in the garden of Gethsemane, but he firmly told his heavenly Father, "Not my will, but thine be done." We all know periods of weakness, weariness, and despair, when we feel life is too difficult.

Like Elijah, we too are journeying toward the mountain of God—eternal life, and we too need "bread" for the

journey. However, ordinary bread will not suffice. We need the bread that Jesus gives—the bread of the Eucharist. On the strength of that food which Jesus gives us in the Eucharist, we will walk all the way to God's eternal Kingdom. Along the way, we will likely have the privilege of being God's messenger to another human being who is experiencing a low moment. It's only the kind of love and support that you expect from people who eat at the same table.

We don't always recognize God's help. Prayer is not always answered by God doing things for us, but sometimes in God helping us to do things for ourselves or for one another. God sends us human angels, and we often get opportunities to be such an angel to someone in need.

Ultimately, the Father sent us his Son as our nourishment, Jesus, who is the Bread of Life. With the strength of this bread, we will walk all the way to his eternal kingdom!

From Pope Benedict's lips to our ears:

The Vatican recently issued a question-and-answer format book that teaches the truth about Jesus & the Catholic Church.

Question: What is the value of private revelations?

Answer: While not belonging to the deposit of faith, private revelations may help a person to live the faith as long as they lead to Christ.

The Magisterium of the Church, which has the duty of evaluating such private revelations, cannot accept those which claim to surpass or correct that definitive Revelation which is Christ.

How St. Jerome Parish arose from 'Velika Gospa'

"Velika Gospa" (literally "Great Lady" in Croatian) is Our Lady's greatest feast day: August 15, Assumption Day, the day recalling her bodily assumption into heaven.

On "Velika Gospa" 291 years ago, the town of Sinj (in Croatia) was miraculously delivered from an impending attack by the Ottoman Empire, after the Croatians of Sinj held an all-night "Velika Gospa" prayer vigil. The Croatians of Sinj are still tremendously grateful for their deliverance by Our Lady's help on Velika Gospa, which is marked by a grand procession, Mass and festivities.

Almost two centuries later, many Croatians from Sinj emigrated to Bridgeport in Chicago, bringing with them their love and gratitude toward Our Lady.

In 1906, these Croatian immigrants first celebrated Velika Gospa (in a Bohemian parish) with a simple procession at a Croatian-language Mass. Thereafter, the celebration of Velika Gospa in Bridgeport grew, borrowing ideas from how Velika Gospa was grandly celebrated in Sinj, Croatia. In 1912, these Croatian Catholics who were brought together by their love and gratitude toward Our Lady managed to establish their own Croatian parish: St. Jerome's. St. Jerome's grew out of devotion to Velika Gospa! Accordingly, the church has a Velika Gospa shrine, with a replica of the icon of Our Lady of Sinj. During St. Jerome's entire existence, the feast of Velika Gospa has been central to its parish life.
