#### **WEEKLY MEDITATION for the 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time**

The man in today's Gospel who asked Jesus, "Will only a few be saved?" obviously thought that heaven was a select club to which only members are admitted. He was a Jew and believed that only Jews would reach heaven. Gentiles had no hope of getting in, and as for sinners — forget it!.

Jesus' answer blew his assumptions to bits. He turned everything upside down when he said, "The first will be last, and the last will be first." He befriended sinners and outcasts de-

claring that he came to seek out and save people such as these. He told those who thought they could enter the Kingdom as a matter of course to produce the fruits of repentance, otherwise their privileged position would benefit them nothing.

Jesus said that conversion was a necessary disposition for entry into the Kingdom. Those who resisted his call to conversion excluded themselves from the Kingdom.

Salvation is not something we can

earn. It is a gift from God, yet this doesn't mean we should not try to make ourselves worthy of it. We must endeavor to produce the fruits of the



Kingdom, namely, goodness, right living and truth.
