# THE CHRISTMAS SEASON

January 1 is both the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, and a day of prayer for world peace. We can deepen our celebration of the New Year by our prayer that our families and our world be

The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord commemorates the final "Christmas" feast, when the Father reveals the divinity of Jesus at his baptism through the Holy Spirit in the Jordan River. It is a good day to celebrate our own baptism, our "new birth" in Christ and inclusion in his body, the Church.

#### What Gives You Life?

During the bombing raids of World War II, thousands of children were orphaned and left to starve. The fortunate ones were rescued and placed in refugee camps where they received food and good care, but many of these children who had lost so much could not sleep at night. They feared waking up to find themselves once again homeless and without food. Nothing seemed to reassure them. Finally, someone hit upon the idea of giving each child a piece of bread to hold at bedtime. Holding their bread, these children could finally sleep in peace. All through the night the bread reminded them, "Today I ate and I will live to eat again tomorrow."

It is not merely a coincidence that the Christ Child was born in Bethlehem. Bethlehem is Hebrew for "house of bread." Christ, the giver of life, was born to become the Bread of Life.....our spiritual sustenance...

# Is Christmas Season starting or ending?

The secular Christmas Shopping Season overlapped with our Advent Season. The Christmas Shopping Season is now over, but the true Christmas Season is NOT ending this weekend! Indeed, the Church's Christmas Season is just beginning this weekend. It will last two weeks, until the day after Epiphany Sunday. Before Epiphany was transferred to Sundays a couple of decades ago, Epiphany was always January 6, which is the 12th Day of Christmastime, as in the song "The Twelve Days of Christmas." Let's look at that song that reminds us that Christmas Joy will not end this weekend.


In England during the years 1528 to 1829, Catholics were not allowed to practice their faith openly. Thus *The Twelve Days of Christmas* was written as a secret Catholic catechism for teaching children, and it served as a reminder for adults. The symbolism of the song represents the basic truths of the Catholic faith.

"My true love gave to me" = God's Love gave to me.

"A partridge in a pear tree" = God's only Son, Jesus.

"Two turtle doves" = the old and new Testaments

"Three French hens" = the revelation that God is a Trinity: Father, Son and Holy Spirit





- "Six geese *a-laying*" = the six days of creation
- "Seven swans a-swimming" = the seven Sacraments
- "Eight maids a-milking"=the eight Beatitudes in the Sermon on the Mount
- "Nine ladies dancing"=the nine fruits of the Holy Spirit (in Galatians 5:22)
- "Ten lords a-leaping" = the Ten Commandments
- "Eleven pipers piping" = the Eleven faithful Apostles
- "Twelve drummers drumming"=the 12 points of belief in the Apostles' Creed

**TAX BREAK ABOUT TO EXPIRE:** On Dec. 31, a provision of the "Emergency Tax Relief Act of 2005" will expire. From August 28, 2005 (when Hurricane Katrina hit) until the end of this year, charitable gifts can be used to **offset** up to 100% of adjusted gross income, instead of the normal 50% limit.
