WEEKLY MEDITATION for the Second Sunday of Advent

In today's Gospel we hear the voice of St. John the Baptist announcing the good news that the long-awaited savior was about to arrive. He tries to prepare the way of the Lord.

One of the great things that Advent does is remind us of God's faithful love for his people, and how Jesus fulfills this love. A Christian is someone who is journeying in faith toward the promised land of eternal glory. What sustains the Christian is God's love and

faithfulness to his word and promise.

If we aren't careful, we can easily forget God's promise as we hear the many voices of the world that call us in other directions — the hate-filled

voices ... the selfish voices ... the distracting, superficial, tempting voices of the media ... the carefully planned, persuasive voices of advertising calling



us to self-indulgence.

But God too calls us. Usually his voice is the most gentle and quiet voice of all. It can so easily be drowned out by the pressures, demands, and distractions of daily life, but the call is always there

because God is faithful. God is true to his word. God keeps his promises. It's up to us to respond and to prepare the way of the Lord in our lives.

The voice of John the Baptist was a solitary voice that many of his contemporaries ignored.

There are many solitary voices in our world.

Celebrate the Blessed Virgin Mary,

Patroness of the United States and Empress of the Americas

This week we celebrate two aspects of the Mother of God's spiritual motherhood to us, her children.

Monday is the great feast day celebrating the Immaculate Conception of Mary, the day celebrating the conception of Mary without sin in the womb of her mother, St. Ann. God saw it to be fitting that his Son would be conceived in a human being protected from the start of her existence from every stain of Evil. This Monday is a holy day of obligation for us here because Mary is the Patron Saint of the United States under the title of the "Immaculate Conception."
