WEEKLY MEDITATION for the Third Sunday of Advent

John the Baptist had a central role to play in the coming of the Savior. His role was to be "a witness to speak for the light." The Light in question was Jesus. John proved to be a courageous and effective witness. Jesus still needs witnesses. Now it's our turn. For many people in the world today, Christ has become a very dim and distant figure, and the words of today's Gospel are literally true: "There is one among you whom you not recognize." Christ needs people who can effectively make him present to other people.

We can't be a witness for the Light if we ourselves are living in darkness. We have to be living in the Light. A good life is a strong and effective witness in and of itself because it is a proclamation of the Gospel. Without the witness of Christians, the face of Christ will continue to fade from our world and the Good News will not be preached.

No witness reaches others as persuasively as the witness of those who do what Jesus commanded. We must be his light in the world.

WISDOM'S CORNER

A WITNESS TO THE LIGHT

A priest tells how a few years ago he made a visit to China. While there, he met an elderly couple who were both doctors. They had studied together at medical school, fallen in love and married. She was a Catholic: he was not. She wanted to convince him that he should join the Church, but he did not wish to be baptized. A short time later she had a child. During one of China's political movements, the husband and many other intellectuals were arrested and sent to a labor camp. The separation was very diffi-cult for the wife. In addition to her loneliness, she was under pressure from the government to divorce her husband and renounce her religion so that she could gain political advantages. She refused. Every night she and her son knelt to pray and ask God for strength to endure the hardships. At the end of the 1970s her husband was allowed to come home. When she and her son went to meet him at the railway station, they were the only family members on the platform to welcome the returnees. Unable to endure the long separation and hardships, all the other women had divorced and remarried. Deeply moved, her husband took instruction and was later baptized.

That woman bore witness to the Light just as truly as John the Baptist did.
