## **WEEKLY MEDITATION for the Fourth Sunday of Advent**

**Today many seek fulfillment and happiness** through "doing their own thing." It's what *I* want that matters. There can be a lot of selfishness in this approach. It often means taking the easiest path in the belief that this is where freedom and happiness lie, but it is more likely to lead to slavery and unhappiness.

Here is an important truth:

freedom, happiness, and fulfillment are more likely to be found in the acceptance of duty. However, for this to happen, it has to be a loving acceptance of duty. A grim or bitter acceptance is not good enough. The more difficult the task to which we devote ourselves out of love, the more it will exalt us.

In this, Mary gives us a great example. She didn't say, "Sorry, I

have my own plans." She said, "It's not what I want, but what God wants that matters. Let what God wants be done to me." Life imposes a lot of duties on us. Those who accept duty as Mary did may not find happiness and fulfillment in the eyes of the world, but they certainly will find it in the eyes of God, and deep down, they will know it.

### A Leap of Trust

Years ago a widowed father lived with his young son and daughter in a southern town in America. He was strict with the kids but good to them, and they loved him. He was an upright man and an excellent lawyer. However, he made himself very unpopular in the town by defending a black man who was accused of murder. At the end of his street lived an elderly woman who spent her afternoons sitting on her front porch. Each day as the lawyer's children passed her house she called their father names. One evening the son, in anger, destroyed some of her flowers. Then he ran home and admitted it to his father who insisted that he apologize to her. Reluctantly the son did so. The woman asked him if he would read to her for an hour each evening. His father made him agree to do so. Each evening he went and read for the old lady. During the hour she would experience violent fits of trembling, which gradually became less frequent. One evening the children learned that the lady had died peacefully, and they seemed thankful to hear the news. The father told them that before she died she had expressed to him how much being with the boy had helped her. The boy felt ashamed and remarked that he should have been nicer to her. "It doesn't matter," the father said. "The main thing is that you did what I asked you to do. You are a good son and I am proud of you."

Although the boy didn't realize the full significance of the task his father asked him to perform, he did it in a spirit of love and obedience to his father.
