WEEKLY MEDITATION for the Fourth Sunday of Advent—Christmas

Christmas is a wonderful time. It recalls the greatest event in history, the Incarnation, when God's Son came down on earth to confer on us the dignity of children of God. We may consider ourselves very ordinary, but nobody is ordinary any longer, not since Christ — truly God and truly human — came on earth.

The world today is in danger of drowning in bad news. It is crying out



for good news. The best news of all is the news brought by the angels to the shepherds: "Behold, I proclaim to you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For today, in the city of David, a Savior has been born for you who is Messiah and Lord."

It is up to us to open our hearts to receive him and enter into an intimate relationship with God, trusting that we will receive love, and always more love. With Christmas, people's hopes soar; however, the substance of these hopes is often dictated by commercial interest. Then, when the sun goes down on Christmas Day, many feel disappointed. Those who pin their hopes on what merchants promise will always be disappointed, not because merchants promise too little, but too much — of the wrong thing. Let us not deprive ourselves of the real hope of Christmas, Christ himself!

Franciscan Friars: 1209-2009, and beyond...

Continuing our gradual look at the Franciscan Friars as they approach their 800th birthday as a Religious Order, we focus our attention on how Saint Francis changed forever the way that we celebrate Christmas, which he called "the feast of feasts."

St. Francis re-enacts the Nativity for the first time

Francis was fascinated by two things about Jesus: One, the utter humility of the manner through which He came to dwell among us in the manger, and, two, the immense love and charity shown toward us by Christ in His suffering and dying for us on the cross.

As Christ's birthday approached in December 1223, a couple of years before Francis's own death, Francis asked a trusted friend to diligently prepare in the Italian town of Greccio an unheard of idea: a Nativity Scene re-enactment. Francis told his friend that he wanted to "set before our bodily eyes in some way the inconveniences of [Jesus'] infant needs, how He lay in a manger, how — with an ox and an ass standing by — He lay upon the hay where He had been placed." Two weeks later it was Christmas Eve and the crowds were filled with joy to see their town turned into a new Bethlehem, complete with manger, hay, ox and ass. Over the manger, Mass was celebrated. Francis, who was a deacon, sang the Gospel and preached with affection about Jesus, the poor King, the Child of Bethlehem, giving the people a fervent, treasured memory of the humble birth of Jesus, truly God but also truly human.

One virtuous man there saw a vision of a child in the manger, but the child was lifeless. Then St. Francis went up to the manger and roused the child, as if from a deep sleep. This was a very fitting vision, given how Francis brought to life a love for the Child Jesus in the hearts of many who had grown cold.

We prepared all Advent, spiritually and physically, for Jesus' birthday. The moment we have been preparing to celebrate is upon us — let's not miss appreciating this key moment amid all the busy-ness of Christmas. At the following Masses, may our spiritual preparation lead us to an intense experience of how our Savior came to us out of God's love for each of us:

Christmas Eve Children's Mass, Monday, Dec. 24, at 6:00 p.m. Come see our schoolchildren re-enact the events of the first Christmas.

Midnight Mass on Christmas Eve, Monday night at 12 midnight, the Mass begins. As part of your preparation for this most solemn high Mass, you are invited to come early to pray and to listen to Croatian Christmas songs — the music and singing starts at 11 p.m.

Christmas Day Masses, Tuesday, the Masses are as on Sundays: 7:30, 9:30 & 11:00 a.m.

Next Sunday the 12 Days of Christmas are still very much going on, as we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family: Jesus, Mary & Joseph.
