WEEKLY MEDITATION — Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch!"

The Gospel story is not so much a story about fishing, but about trust. Jesus was saying to Peter: "How far are you prepared to trust me?" It was a turning point in the life of Peter. What started out as a failed night of fishing ended in a new beginning, starting out in a new direction.

Fishing was an important occupation, but Jesus was calling Peter and

his companions to an even more important occupation. He was offering them not just new work, but the cause to which they would dedicate their lives. They understood that he was calling them to the service of others: "I will make you fishers of men."

The Lord still calls people, and the need is just as great today.

There are still those who respond. Some people (like the Apostles) are called to dedicate themselves totally. But all of us are called to holiness. By our baptism we too are called to follow Christ, but what does the following of Christ mean for the ordinary person? It means to be a Christian where you are and in your chosen profession. There are more ways than one to serve Christ and his Gospel. The call in the first instance in not to an apostolate, but to discipleship. The Lord's power is always available to us. How will we individually respond to him?

THE SECRET WORD IS ...

Two men met in the marketplace of Jerusalem in the days before the Crucifixion. The first one said to the other, "Do you think we should offer our help to those who follow this Jesus of Nazareth?" The second man said, "I have often thought of that, but when I see that he seems to have a chosen few who help him, I do not want to try to break into this inner circle of disciples." The first man agreed. "You always see the same group of disciples. It is as if they are members of a secret club who have a secret word among them".

One of those disciples about whom they had been speaking overheard them, approached them, and said, "You are right in saying that there is an inner circle of disciples, and if you would like to join, I shall teach you the secret word." "Let's hear it," said the men to the disciple.

"When Jesus first came to us, he needed many hands to help in his work. He invited many, but only those who knew the secret word remained to help. ... The secret word is 'Yes.'"
