WEEKLY MEDITATION — Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Most of us think we have done our Christian duty if we refrain from doing harm to our enemy, but Jesus asks more of us. He asks us to *love* our enemies. Even though this is difficult, it can be done.

Even on a human level the teaching of Jesus makes sense. The escalation of evil can be stopped only by one who does not pass the evil on. Revenge and retaliation only add darkness to darkness. By adopting a vindictive attitude, we become poisoned by hatred. We use up a huge amount of energy in hating. Revenge may satisfy one's rage, but it makes the heart sterile.

Love releases extraordinary energies in us. The power of love is greater than the power of evil. Still, one of the most difficult things in the world is to love someone who hates you. Yet true love includes loving the difficult and unlovable. Mercy is stronger than vengeance. When Jesus says, "Forgive your enemies," it is not only for the sake of the enemy, but also for one's own sake because love is more holy than hate.

It is a struggle to overcome the feelings of bitterness and revenge that well up inside us and can keep welling up when we are badly treated by another. We need to let go of that inner anger through forgiveness. Forgiveness is never easy. Each day it must be struggled for, and prayed for and won. Resentments can smolder for a long time. Prayer is the only answer. Anger cannot continue to develop where there is humble, sincere prayer.

WISDOM'S CORNER

Respond to darkness with Light

During the tragic conflict between the Northern Ireland Catholics and Protestants in recent decades, there was a woman in the main city of Belfast whose husband was shot as he drove the family to Mass. Soon after the tragedy she was praying with the children when her young son asked, "Mommy, will the men who killed Daddy go to heaven?"

Breathing a silent prayer, the mother replied, "If they are really sorry and ask Jesus to forgive them, then they will go to heaven."

On hearing this the boy remarked, "Well, if they are going to be there, I don't want to be in heaven with them."

The mother thought about this for a while, then replied, "If Jesus forgives and saves them, setting them free from their terrible sin, he will change them. They will be completely different people."

The youngster paused, then said, "Mommy, let's pray for these men and ask Jesus to save them."

Lent begins this Wednesday

The 40 days of Lent begin on Ash Wednesday this week. Lent is the liturgical season of the year that invites us:

- to fast from food and worldly distractions,
- to do penance (for purifying and strengthening ourselves),
- to pray more frequently and more deeply,
- to do acts of love (especially the Lenten tradition of "almsgiving," or donating to the poor).

In these 40 days of fasting, penance, prayer and almsgiving, we ideally undergo a spiritual conversion to become better followers of Christ. Then as better followers, we can be closer to Jesus as we remember his suffering and death during Holy Week. We might truly feel in our hearts his suffering for the world. We might join our suffering with his — for the good of the world. And as his followers, we also look forward to the Resurrection.

From Pope Benedict's lips to our ears:

The Vatican recently issued a question-and-answer format book that teaches the truth about Jesus & the Catholic Church.

Question: What are the essential forms of Christian prayer?

Answer: They are (1) blessing and (2) adoration, the prayer of (3) petition and (4) intercession, (5) <u>thanksgiving</u> and (6) <u>praise</u>. The Eucharist contains and expresses all the forms of prayer.

(5) The Church <u>gives thanks to God</u> unceasingly, above all in celebrating the Eucharist in which Christ allows her to participate in his own thanksgiving to the Father. For the Christian every event becomes a reason for giving thanks.

(6) <u>Praise</u> is that form of prayer which recognizes most immediately that God is God. It is a completely disinterested prayer: it sings God's praise for his own sake and gives him glory simply because he is.

LENTEN FASTING: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are **days of fasting** when Catholics 18 to 59 years old are duty-bound to eat only one (meatless) full meal, and two smaller (meatless) meals. Of course, expectant and nursing moms, as well as the sick, are **not** duty-bound.

ABSTAINING FROM MEAT IN LENT: On Fridays during Lent, Catholics 14 years old and older are duty-bound to eat no meat (fish is not a meat), and of course expectant and nursing moms and the sick are exempt.



THE DEVOTION OF THE STATIONS OF THE CROSS will be prayed in English every Lenten Friday at 7 p.m. in our church.
