### **WEEKLY MEDITATION** — First Sunday of Lent

All of us human beings are weak and susceptible to evil. This may be a disturbing truth, but it is one that we ignore at our own peril. One great problem of our times is our failure to know ourselves, to recognize sin and deal with it within ourselves. We benefit from knowing and accepting this humbling truth of the human condition.

We frequently have to struggle against the evil that is done by society and by others, but our hardest struggle is against the evil that originates inside | was no once-and-for-all victory. He had

us. We are born with conflicting impulses, so that doing good is always possible but never easy.

Jesus' temptation was no playacting. It was real. The temptations of Jesus are the temptations of Christians in all ages: (1) to live for material things alone; (2) to seek one's own glory rather than God's glory; and (3) to abandon the worship of God for the worship of worldly power and fame.

Jesus' desert victory over Satan

won a battle, not the war. There would be other attacks that would need to be repelled. The same is true for us. Some people think that they should reach a stage when they will be beyond the reach of temptation. Jesus was taunted and tempted on the cross. But he resisted to the end too, winning the war.

Lent calls us to turn from sin and be faithful to the Gospel, Jesus struggled against temptation and will help us overcome ours. When temptation weighs us down, Jesus' mercy will raise us up!

## Contests build our strength

Please support our priests by praying for wisdom in their decisions, and also support them through your understanding how their time for parish matters will be very limited during these days.


