WEEKLY MEDITATION for the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Some time after John the Baptist had baptized Jesus, he saw Jesus passing by. Turning to his disciples he said, "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world." With these generous and prophetic words John introduced Jesus to his own disciples.

These words tell us a lot about the identity and mission of Jesus, but also tell us a lot about the kind of person John was. John could have ignored or

criticized Jesus, yet he pointed him out to the people and glorified him. He saw who Jesus really was, and cooperated in the start of his mission.

There is an important lesson here for us. If we are always finding fault with others or putting them down, we should

look at ourselves. We may be saying



more about ourselves than about other people. Through our baptism we have been called to be disciples of Jesus. This is an honor and a privilege, but we must remember that it is also a call to serve. We must learn from St. John to put our gifts at the ser-

vice of others, not just ourselves.

WISDOM'S CORNER

A tale of two servants

The king of an ancient kingdom once called upon one of his servants, who was known to be a cruel man without any friends, and commanded him to travel throughout the kingdom in search of a truly good person. The man went forth immediately. In the course of his travels he met and spoke with a great number of people; however, after a long time he returned to the king saying, "I have searched the whole kingdom as you asked me, but could not find even one truly good person. All of them, without exception, are mean, cruel, deceitful, and evil. The good person you seek is nowhere to be found."

The king then called another servant. This man was known for his kindness and generosity, and was greatly loved by everyone. The king said to him, "Go and travel throughout my kingdom and find me a truly wicked person." The man went far and wide in his search. After a long time he returned to the king saying, "I have failed in the task you gave me. I found people who are misguided or misled, and those who act in blindness or in passion, but nowhere could I find a truly evil person. All of them are good at heart, despite the bad things they have done."

Tuesday is a national day for prayer and penance

The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops has determined that "In all the dioceses of the United States of America, Jan. 22 shall be observed as a particular **day of penance** for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion, **and of prayer** for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life. The 'Mass for Peace and Justice' should be celebrated with violet vestments as an appropriate liturgical observance for this day."

Thus our bishops invite us in a special way this Tuesday to pray and offer penance on the 35th anniversary of the U.S. Supreme Court's tragic *Roe vs. Wade* decision allowing widespread abortion. Our prayers and penances can give supernatural help to the millions of victims of abortion: the young human beings who were killed; the women and men tricked or forced into participating in abortions; and our whole society, which suffers immensely whenever human life is cheapened and human dignity is violated.
