### **WEEKLY MEDITATION** — Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Gospel is a continuation of last Sunday's reading. We see the reaction to the homily Jesus gave in the synagogue at Nazareth. The people can't believe that the words of Isaiah could apply to him, the humble son of Joseph, so they rise up in fury and attempt to do away with Jesus.

But what happened to Jesus at Nazareth went deeper than this. It wasn't a case of them *not appreciating* him. They rejected him. Why? Because he

pointed out their lack of faith, and told them that the Gentiles were more open to God than they were. The benefits of the promises were meant for all.

Jesus suffered the fate of all prophets — rejection by his own people. Prophecy is not about pleasing people. It's about speaking the truth that almost no one wants to hear, the truth that everyone needs to hear. Jesus' overriding motive was compassion. What was he to do? He could have

given up on them or done whatever would please them, but in that case, the special gift that he wanted to give them — the Truth (which they sorely needed) — would be lost.

Our faith tells us that Jesus is Our Lord and Savior — something his own townsfolk could not believe. They had a hard time accepting Jesus. What about us?

Jesus, I trust in you! And, Jesus, increase my trust in you!
