WEEKLY MEDITATION for the 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"The kingdom of heaven is like a treasure buried in a field, which a person finds and hides again, and out of joy goes and sells all that he has and buys that field."

Today's parable from Jesus (about giving all we have to buy a buried treasure) might remind us of the saying: "Where your treasure is, there your heart will be."

What or who do we hold dear? What or who is our treasure? Will

our dearest treasure be gone in a couple of years, or decades? Or is our treasure Jesus?

It is easy to take Jesus for granted. He whispers invitingly. He doesn't yell. He doesn't force himself upon us. He seeks our freely given response of love. Love cannot be compelled or forced. He wants our love. And he wants our time. In the parable, the person sells *all* he has to buy



the field with the treasure. We can ask ourselves: do we give time for prayer, for going

to Mass (to give our thanksgiving every week), do we love Jesus by following his teaching and that of the church he founded to teach in his name, do we love our most vulnerable neighbors?

WISDOM'S CORNER

Receiving the Word

The Word of God is to the human heart what a seed is to the earth.

Just as a seed needs soil, so the Word needs a receptive heart.

The earth responds to the rain and sun so that even a desert can bloom.

But a hard and dry human heart has the power to resist responding, so that it can remain barren if it resists stubbornly.

So we need to pray, in order to soften our hearts and make them more receptive.

Lord Jesus, soften our hearts with your grace.

Open them with your gentle love.

so that the precious seed of Your Word may take root in our hearts

and bear fruit in our lives.

This coming Saturday is special Franciscan feast day: The Feast of Our Lady of the Portiuncola


Because St. Jerome's is a Franciscan parish (since its 1912 founding, only Franciscan priests have been assigned here), we can receive the famous Portiuncola Plenary Indulgence for oneself or for a departed soul. It is very simple to receive. Simply <u>VISIT</u> our church ON SATURDAY, AUG. 2, and say the Creed (the profession of faith), as well as an Our Father, a Hail Mary and a Glory Be for the Pope's intentions this month. To complete the indulgence, go to Sacramental Confession (during the eight days before or after Aug. 2) and receive Communion at Mass.

St. Francis's great love for Our Lady and his love for her chapel of Our Lady of the Angels, nicknamed the Portiuncola

St. Francis of Assisi, who had previously repaired the chapels of San Damiano and St. Peter's in Assisi, was enraptured by a third chapel that he would repair: Our Lady of the Angels, with its humble nickname "the Portiuncola," which means "the little portion." Away from the town of Assisi, the tiny chapel's isolation gave it peace and silence, and it was close to the leper hospitals where Francis cared for the lepers.

On February 24, 1208, the Feast of St. Matthias, while hearing Mass at the Portiuncola, Francis recognized his life's calling in that day's Gospel reading: Preach the Gospel; take nothing for the journey; stay with those who are worthy in the towns you visit.

On August 2, 1216, Francis announced great news to the people at the Portiuncola that day: "I desire to send you all to Paradise by announcing to you the indulgence which has been granted me by Pope Honorius! Know then that all those present, and those who shall

come after in the future to this church to pray, will receive the remission of their sins. I should have liked to have had this indulgence granted for a week, but I have only succeeded in getting it for one day." Later, the Plenary Indulgence was extended to all Franciscan churches around the world. If the conditions required for the full indulgence are not met, then the indulgence is partial.

Francis would make the Portiuncola the headquarters of his Franciscan Order. On October 3, 1226, after blessing his friars, Francis died at the Portiuncola after recommending the chapel to the faithful protection and care of his brethren.
