WEEKLY MEDITATION — Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

In the Gospel, Jesus spoke of a deficient type of follower.

When he said, "No one who sets a hand to the plow and looks to what was left behind is fit for the kingdom of God," he was stressing the need for

commitment, saying there shouldn't be constant re-analysis of the decision to commit to Christ. Give your undivided attention to what you are doing. If you keep looking back, a lack of faithfulness

is indicated. Dedication, resolve and faithfulness are needed. You began a worthy task; give it your all.

All of us have put our hand to some "plow." For example, a man and woman commit for life to their marriage, and a priest commits for life to his call from God. In baptism we all have put our hands to a plow — the following of Christ, or discipleship.

If we keep looking back, our heart will be divided, and so will our energy.

We won't be fully committed. We will be half-hearted, like a losing ball club. We are likely to lose time, lose sight of our goal, and be sorely tempted in challenging times to turn back or quit.

We need to keep looking forward and give our whole heart to following the Way of Christ, not our old paths. This resolve will give us the strength to persevere, with the grace of God, and remain faithful to Jesus and his teachings.

Remaining Faithful

A doctor who was a prisoner in a Nazi camp, tended his sick and dying inmates as much as possible. Near the end of the war he and a friend devised an escape. When the time to leave came, he decided to visit his "patients" for the last time. He came to a man who was close to death, hiding from him the fact that he was about to escape camp. The man wasn't fooled. In a sad voice he said to the doctor, "So you too are getting out."

The doctor denied it, but the man's words cut to his heart. After finishing his final rounds he returned to the same man, who greeted him with a look of despair. The look made him feel that he was betraying this man. Suddenly he decided to abandon the escape and stay with his patients. At once the unhappy feeling of betrayal left him. Even though he had no idea what the days ahead would bring, he gained an inner peace he had never before experienced. He also survived the camp.

Something to contemplate the 4th of July 2007

An 1863 Proclamation by the President of the United States of America:

We [the United States] have been the recipients of the choicest bounties of Heaven. We have been preserved, these many years, in peace and prosperity. We have grown in numbers, wealth and power, as no other nation has ever grown. But we have forgotten God. We have forgotten the gracious hand which preserved us in peace, and multiplied and enriched and strengthened us; and we have vainly imagined, in the deceitfulness of our hearts, that all these blessings were produced by some superior wisdom and virtue of our own. Intoxicated with unbroken success, we have become too self-sufficient to feel the necessity of redeeming and preserving grace, too proud to pray to the God that made us!

It behooves us then, to humble ourselves before the offended Power, to confess our national sins, and to pray for clemency and forgiveness.

Now, therefore, in compliance with the request, and fully concurring in the views of the Senate, I do, by this my proclamation, designate ... a day of national humiliation, fasting and prayer.

Done at the City of Washington, this 30th day of March, in the year of our Lord 1863, and of the Independence of the United States the 87th.

One-Minute Catholic Catechism:

As we prepare to celebrate the Fourth of July, we consider the question, In the eyes of the Roman Catholic Church, what is "freedom"?

Freedom is the *power*, rooted in Reason and Will, to act or not to act, to do this or that, and so to perform *deliberate* actions on

one's own responsibility. By Free Will, one shapes one's own life. Human freedom is a *force* for growth and maturity in Truth and Goodness; freedom attains its perfection when directed toward God.

Until we are totally united to God, there is the possibility of *choosing* between good and evil, and thus of growing in perfection or of failing and sinning.

The more one does what is good, the freer one becomes. A person of virtue is truly free.

There is no *true* freedom except in the service of what is good and just. The choice to disobey and do evil is an abuse of freedom and leads to "the slavery of sin." Clearly, enslavement to sin is not true freedom, but rather a false freedom. A person of habitual sin, of vice, isn't free.
