WEEKLY MEDITATION for the 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's Gospel many of us will sympathize with Martha. Jesus praised Martha's sister, Mary, who sat and listened, rather than Martha, who did all the work.

Jesus was making a point for the benefit of people like Martha, who are essentially generous but overly anxious about getting things done. It's not simply that she was busy, but that she was too busy to pay attention to what was most important.

Our daily lives are made up of chores and duties that fall into two categories: urgent and essential. Many of the things we do are "urgent," but only a few are truly "essential." We have to distinguish between the two, and give priority to the "essential."

Martha gave priority to the urgent and neglected the essential. Mary got her priorities right—she dropped everything and listened to the words of Jesus when he was in her midst. Action and contemplation are not meant to be contrasted. Both are necessary, and have to be integrated into life.

Working generously is important. but so is receiving from Jesus, listening to Jesus.

Obviously, it is not enough to know how to give. We must also know how to receive. Both are graced activities. Everything in our lives benefits when we spend time with Jesus.

WISDOM'S CORNER

Giving and Receiving

I had a dream that Jesus Himself was coming to my house, just like He came to the house of Martha and Mary. So I scrubbed it from top to bottom. I set the table with my best dinnerware, and beautiful candles and flowers. For food I spared no expense. I even rolled out a red carpet.

He came and I think I did Him proud, waiting on Him hand and foot. He, for His part, was most gracious. Everything went off like *clockwork*. When He left I felt good, vet something began to bother me. A question arose within me: What did He want from me? Food? Hospitality? Then I heard a second question sounding inside me: What was it that He wanted to give me? I felt sure that He wanted to give me something, but whatever it was, I gave Him no opportunity to give it to me. I created the impression that everything was perfect and that I wanted for nothing. I realize now that I missed getting something even more important than what I gave.

Prayer is where we meet God, where we offer ourselves to him and where we struggle to understand how profoundly he has offered him-


have a remote relationship with Our Father, the One Whom we address true ways to draw near to Jesus in when we pray as Jesus taught us.

#8: Learn to 'let it go.' Think carefully before arguing, fighting, disagreeing, or criticizing. Be an instrument of peace. Being "assertive" has its place, especially in challenging injustice toward the vulnerable, but recall how un-assertive Jesus was during the suffering of his Passion.

#9: Share your faith. Talk about Jesus with people who are curious. God doesn't want us to keep his love all to ourselves. We have to pass it on. But before we can most usefully teach others, we need to know our Faith well—and if we humbly see that we don't know our Faith well enough, we should take steps to learn it. There are many fun books for learning the Faith, and one such book with an amusing title but very accurate doctrine is "Catholicism for Dummies" by Fr. John Trigilio & Fr. Ken Brighenti. Most adults and young people would benefit from this goodhumored book, which is available in most bookstores.
