WEEKLY MEDITATION — 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Each of us has a cross to carry. There is no need to make one or to look for one. The cross we have is hard enough for us, but are we willing to accept it as our cross? Jesus took up His cross. What we have to do is take up ours. Our cross is made not of wood, but of our burdens — worries, problems, illnesses, conflict within the family...the list is endless. Perhaps there is no big cross, only a multiplicity of little crosses. However, enough drops eventually fill the cup to overflowing. The cross we carry may not even be visible to others. It may not be an outward thing, but an inward thing such as depression or grief. These are heavy crosses, though we cannot weigh them on a scale. The most painful cross of all, however, is the one in which we have no choice — for example, the cross of living with a difficult illness or injury. It is a lot easier to choose a cross for oneself than to accept the one that comes, so to speak, in the line of duty. Over and above these crosses are the ones that come to us because we are disciples of Christ. The most common reasons for giving up the practice of the faith are not intellectual, but moral. People know that to follow Christ might subvert their plans, plans that are often self-ish and vain, and would meaning saying no to what they want. Yet, following Christ involves a dying to self. This process begins at Baptism. It is a lifelong process in which we can only persevere with the grace of Christ. Ask for His help to accept and carry your crosses in life as He carried His for love of us.

The Office of Catholic Schools has once again granted full certification to our school based upon completion of the School Improvement Planning Process that took place in the spring. This evaluation process acknowledges that our school provides a learning environment that promotes the Catholic faith and the traditions of educational excellence.

RESPECT FOR LIFE Pope Benedict XVI explores faith and what it means to be Christian in a recently released book entitled The Europe of Benedict: In the Crisis of Cultures, which he wrote while still Cardinal Ratzinger. In it he discusses issues that are expected to be the priorities of his pontificate. One of them is the need to respect life from conception to its natural death. He states that there is no such thing as a "little homicide" and that when man loses the respect for life, he inevitably ends up "losing his own identity." He chastises parents who think their rights to freedom trump the rights of the unborn child, saying: "They become blind to the right to life of another, of the youngest and weakest who don't have a voice." He further admonishes: "Accepting that the rights of the weakest can be violated means that you accept also that the right of force prevails over the force of rights."
