# **WEEKLY MEDITATION for the Tenth Sunday of Ordinary Time**

Jesus' attitude toward sinners was one of kindness and persuasion rather than condescension and condemnation. He didn't wait for sinners to repent before becoming their friend; he befriended sinners.

Jesus' reason was very straightforward — he said he went where the need was greatest. In associating with sinners he wasn't condoning their sins,

rather, he was trying to show them a new way of life. In acting as he did, Jesus revealed the mercy of God. He put sinners in touch with God's love for them. In their response to that love, they tried let go of their sins in order to better follow Jesus.

Jesus was recognized as a holy man, yet he accepted sinners. Jesus distinguished between the sinner and the sin. a I w a y s condemning the evil of sin, but offering the sinner forgiveness. His overriding motive for acting



ing motive Jesus befriends Matthew for acting the tax collector as he did was one of compassion born of love.
