## WEEKLY MEDITATION — Holy Trinity Sunday

The Holy Trinity is greater than us all. We can never fully comprehend the Holy Trinity. We struggle to understand even earthly things, so how can we grasp God? Only the Holy Spirit's gift of Wisdom can help us to understand the ways of God.

It is very important to have a correct image of God. If we get this wrong, everything else will be out of focus. How can we pray properly, or how can we have a proper relationship

with the Holy Trinity if we have a false or inadequate image of God? After all, we need to see our lives as a response to the Holy Trinity's love.

To tell what God is like, all we have to do is look at Jesus. In the words of St. Paul, "He is the image of the invisible God." So, what is Jesus like? A key image we have of Jesus is that of the Good Shepherd. Jesus himself used this image. Very obviously, we see in Jesus the Father's love for us. But

what of the Holy Spirit? The Holy Spirit is the bond of love between the Father and the Son, and between God and us.

The mystery of the Holy Trinity is something worthy of study and appreciation. But it is also something to pray about and to live. The Christian lives in the world of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. It is the world of our everyday lives where God manifests himself to us.

## WISDOM'S CORNER

## In His Eyes

A mother describes a touching moment with her son. When he was 4 years old, she was rocking him in a high-backed wooden rocking chair, as was her habit.

Suddenly, he sat up straight, lifted his head and stared intensely into her eyes. He became very still and she stopped rocking. He cupped her face in his little hands and said in a near whisper, "Mommy, I'm in your eyes!"

They stayed that way for several long moments, staring into one another's eyes. The rocking stopped and the room grew quiet. The mother whispered back, "And I'm in yours."

In the days that followed, the little boy would often check to see if his discovery still held true. "Am I still in your eyes, Mommy?" he would ask, reaching up to her. She would pull him close to her so he could look in her eyes and see for himself—he was still there!

Should we ever doubt that we are the focus of God's tender care and attention, remember that Jesus' death and Resurrection are proof of how dear and precious we are to him, and so we can be confident that through the Holy Spirit, his love has been poured into our hearts.

# Being watched

Nowadays, thanks to security cameras, we are often being watched, watched by dispassionate eyes intent only on catching us in wrong-doing.

A feeling that someone is coldly watching us is not a pleasant feeling.

But the feeling that someone is watching over us is a good feeling.

God is watching over us.

Knowing that God is watching over us gives us comfort in times of sadness, strength in times of weakness, and hope in times of despair.

## One-Minute Catholic Catechism:

On this Trinity Sunday, let's consider the mystery of the Holy Trinity, the mystery of one God in three Persons: the Father is God, the Son is God, and the Holy Spirit is God and yet there is only one God. There are three Persons in one God. They have the same nature, substance, and being.

Jesus revealed the mystery of the Trinity. He taught the Apostles how from the Father and the eternally

to baptize "in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." Moreover, Jesus revealed that these three Persons are distinct and not just different ways of looking at one Person; for example, by saying "I came forth from the Father," Jesus revealed that he is different from the Father. The Father originated from no one; he is without origin. The Son is eternally begotten. The Holy Spirit comes from the Father and the eternally

begotten Son. The eternal Trinity is three distinct Persons with one and the same divine nature.

Although everything the Three Persons do *outside* the Divine nature is done by all Three, yet it is suitable that we attribute some outside works especially to one or the other Person. So we speak of the Father especially as the power of creation, of the Son as the wisdom of the Father, of the Holy Spirit as goodness and sanctification.


