WEEKLY MEDITATION — Corpus Christi Sunday/ Body and Blood of Christ Sunday

Today's Gospel shows how five loaves, two fish and Jesus can satisfy 5,000 hungry men.

Jesus wanted his disciples to remember. He was not vainly thinking of his own need to be remembered. He was thinking about his disciples. They *needed* to remember. In his love for them he left them a special way of remembering, namely, the Eucharist.

Every time we celebrate the Eucharist Jesus becomes present—

really, truly and substantially present. Through the reception of his body and blood in the Eucharist, our bond with him is strengthened, with the result that we are enabled to enter into a deeper intimacy with him. We are not merely in communication with him, but in communion with him—Holy Communion.

Memory is precious. It connects us with people and events that we can no longer see with our eyes. If we cherish

the memory of our loved ones, they become present to us in our mind's eye. It is a presence we feel rather than see. And yet this remembering is powerful. By remembering them we continue to reap a harvest from what they sowed while among us.

With the Eucharist and our eyes of faith and the power of Jesus, the One who multiplied the loaves and fishes, how much greater a harvest can we reap from what he sowed among us!

The Crucifix and the Host

A father gave a beautiful Crucifix to his little daughter and asked her if she knew the difference between the figure of Jesus on the cross and the Host which the priest consecrates at the Mass.

The little girl stated without hesitation, "Daddy, when I look at the figure on the cross, I *see* Jesus, but he's not *really* there. When I look at the Host, I don't *see* Jesus, but he's *really* there!"

Blessed Mother Teresa had a profound devotion to Jesus in the Holy Eucharist

Mother Teresa's Missionaries of Charity Sisters always make their Daily Holy Hour (their hour adoring Jesus in the Eucharist), regardless of how busy their schedules might be in serving the poorest of the poor.

As Mother Teresa described it, the Holy Hour is the time for their daily family prayer. They gather together and vocally pray the Rosary during the first half-hour. The second half-hour is in silence. Mother knew adoration of the Blessed Sacrament to be the source of grace to sustain the miraculous growth of vocations in her order.

Mother Teresa's deep faith in the Real Presence was the foundation of her mission to the poorest of the poor. Her love for the poor came from the same love she had for Our Lord in the Holy Eucharist. Without that faith in the Real Presence, there would not have been a Mother Teresa.

Her dedicated service to the poor would have been impossible without her dedicated, intense prayer in the Real Presence of Jesus. Can we serve well without a similar connection to Jesus?

One-Minute Catholic Catechism:

On this Corpus Christi/Body and Blood of Christ Sunday, let's consider the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist.

In the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist, we have the **body and blood**, together with the **soul and divinity**, of our Lord Jesus

Christ and, therefore, the whole Christ is truly, really, and substantially contained the consecrated Host.

This presence is called "Real Presence" (with capital letters) because it is presence in the fullest sense: a **substantial** presence whereby Christ, the God-Man, is wholly and entirely present in his divinity and humanity.

The term "Real Presence" is not intended to exclude the other types of presence as if they are not "real" too. Indeed Christ has other "real and true presences" (*without capital letters*). Christ is really and truly present in his Mystical Body the Church; in his Scriptures; in his minister the priest; in a person in the state of grace. But with these, the **whole** Christ is not present.

This Wednesday evening's St. Anthony Feast Day celebration

at our St. Anthony Friary at 4848 S. Ellis Avenue will be unique.

The friary's new outdoor shrine for St. Anthony will be unveiled and blessed, there will be a procession of the Croatian Parishes, the outdoor Mass, and finally refreshments, socializing and music.
