WEEKLY MEDITATION — Second Sunday of Lent

On Mount Tabor, God's light burst forth from the body of Jesus at the Transfiguration. The three apostles were overcome with the brilliance and meaning of it all.

Because of this glimpse of glory that the apostles witnessed, Peter wanted to stay on the mountaintop. He wanted to hold onto the blessedness of the experience. He did not want to go back down to the common things again. Yet Jesus summoned him to go back down the mountain and face the

future. The experience of the Transfiguration was not meant to provide an escape from the struggles that lay ahead, but to help them face Jesus' suffering, death and Resurrection.

We too experience rare moments of extreme light and joy. We get glimpses of the promised land toward which we are traveling in faith. In his love for us, God allows us to taste on earth the joys of the world to come. Those moments of transfiguration are given to us to strengthen us for our

everyday tasks, and to enable us to face our cross, which in some form or another inevitably comes to everyone.

A moment of glory does not exist for its own sake. It clothes the common things with a radiance they never had before. Through prayer and faith we are helped to face the reality of this life with all its difficulties and challenges, to embrace the high and low moments of life, the hilltop and the pit. We can do this with faith and trust in God, with our glimpses of the glory of eternal life.

Remember the Light when you see it

A poor man living in a Dublin shelter for the homeless told the following story. One day he was walking along a street in Dublin. At a certain point he found himself outside a church. Before he realized it, he was inside. He couldn't recall whether or not he said any prayers, but his soul was filled with light. His depression lifted, and a great peace descended on him. He felt that he belonged on this earth after all. He felt close to God and loved by God.

The experience seemed to last a long time, yet he had a feeling it may have lasted only a few minutes. He said he'd gladly give the whole of his life for those few moments. What made the experience so wonderful was the realization that he had done absolutely nothing to deserve it. It was a pure gift from God to him. For one short moment he tasted glory.

However, when it was over he found himself out in the streets once more. He wanted to hold onto that experience, but it never returned. Nonetheless, he had to go forward instead of backward. He used his personal experience of God's glory to illuminate the darkness in his life and to go forward more hopefully and courageously.


