WEEKLY MEDITATION — Fourth Sunday of Lent

The story of the "prodigal son" is a story about hearts: selfish hearts and generous hearts, closed hearts and open hearts, cold hearts and warm hearts, broken hearts and joyful hearts, unrepentant hearts and repentant hearts, unforgiving hearts and forgiving hearts, resentful hearts and grateful hearts.

It reveals so much about the mystery of the human heart. When all is said and done it is the heart that matters. But how can one sum up the heart? The heart is what you are deep down. It is the real you. "Darkness of the heart" is the blackest night of all. "Emptiness of heart" is the greatest poverty of all. "A heavy heart" is the most wearisome burden of all. "A broken heart" is the deepest wound of all.

But Jesus' parable reveals how steadfast is the heart of God. When the father saw his lost son coming toward him, his heart went out to him, and the next minute they were in each other's arms. It is an extraordinary experience to be loved despite being a sinner. Such love is like a breeze to a dying fire, or like rain falling on parched ground. Those who have experienced this kind of love, know something about the heart of God.

Our Father's heart doesn't blow hot and cold. God never closes his heart to any of his children. No matter how far from home they may wander, no matter what they do, *if they return home*, the one thing they can be sure of is a warm and generous welcome from the Father.

WISDOM'S CORNER

Revelation of Love

Gandhi told the story of how, when he was fifteen years old, he stole a little piece of gold from his brother. However, he felt so bad about it that he made up his mind to confess it to his father. He wrote out his sin on a piece of paper, asking for forgiveness and punishment, while promising never to steal again.

At the time his father was in bed, sick. Gandhi handed him the note and sat by the bedside waiting for his judgment. His father sat up in bed and began to read the note. As he read it, tears came into his eyes. Gandhi himself also cried. Instead of getting angry and punishing him, the father hugged his repentant son, and that was the end of the matter.

The experience of being loved while he was in sin had a profound effect on Gandhi. He said later, "Only the person who has experienced this kind of love can know what it is."
