#### WEEKLY MEDITATION— THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT

The Gospel scene depicts an angry Jesus. This picture of Jesus doesn't sit well with the traditional image of a meek and smiling Jesus. It seems to be so out of character from the rest of the Gospels that we might be tempted to dismiss it. That would be a mistake. Jesus' anger shows us another side to his character. Of course

Jesus was gentle, but that doesn't mean he was weak. When the occasion demanded it, he could be very strong and assertive.

Anger can be a good thing. It can spur us to put right something that is blatantly wrong. There are times when we ought to be angry. An unjust situation should make us angry — anger can at times be an

expression of love.

We have to look at the things that make us angry. It is said that you can measure the size of a person's soul by the size of the things that make him angry. Most of our anger is motivated by self-interest or by petty things. We must keep our anger in the right spirit. It must be motivated by love of God and others.
