WEEKLY MEDITATION — Fifth Sunday of Lent

In story of the woman caught in adultery there appears to be only one sin involved—the sin of adultery. But there are other sins there. There is the sin of the way the Scribes and Pharisees treated the woman, exploiting her to try to entrap Jesus. There is also the sin involved in their attitude toward Jesus and their desire to get rid of him.

Yet Jesus treats everyone gently. He did not condemn anyone. He made them aware of their own sins and invited them to judge themselves. He

gave them time to change their sinful ways. His mission was about mercy and forgiveness, not judgment and condemnation. He did not come to expose the sores of people but to heal them.

Jesus illuminated a dark scene with the radiance of his mercy. There is a lesson here for us. It's easy to condemn others. We must learn from the example of Jesus to condemn the sin, not the sinner. The very act of condemning another involves a sin! It is an act of charity to correct another, but there is an art in doing so. It consists of being totally kind and totally honest at the same time. Honesty without kindness can be destructive.

We must look to ourselves. We must be willing to extend to others the same mercy we would like to receive if we were involved in the same situation. It is important in life than to show mercy for a fellow human being because none of us is without sin. Jesus said in the Sermon on the Mount: "Blessed are the merciful, for mercy shall be theirs."
