WEEKLY MEDITATION— FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT

God chose the approach of love, not of power. God took the first step — he sent to us his Son, the Light. He did not wait to be pacified by us before he would forgive us. Moreover, he acted not for his own sake but for our sake. His love is all-inclusive. It is given to the children of the Light *and* to the children of darkness. God offers the Light to all. We cooperate with God by accepting his Light and his love. If

people get lost, it is because they need to renew their efforts to use God's Light, not their own lights, or the world's lights. Alas, when we are lost, the fault lies not with God, but with ourselves.

People who do evil things have a tendency to hate the Light because it reveals themselves to themselves. They hate goodness because it reveals their evil; they hate industry because it reveals their laziness. They often try to destroy light, goodness, love, in order to avoid the pain of self-discovery.

It is terrible to reject God's Light, He offers love and Light; how sweet it is to be loved and to walk in the Light! Let us accept God's gift and try to respond in kind. After all, we are able to love God because God loved us first.

Charity towards others during Lent —it's for kids and for adults

Lent is a time for increasing our acts of charity. The following list can help young people creatively increase their acts of loving charity towards others. This list can also serve to stimulate charitable acts by those of us who are older...

- # Remember that acts of charity are a way to imitate Jesus, and bring us closer to Jesus.
- # Brainstorm with family to see what kind deeds you can do.
- ∉# Help your teacher.
- ∉# Call a grandparent to say 'I love you.'
- # Invite an unpopular child to join your games.
- # Help an elderly neighbor with yard work.
- # Set the table, load the dishwasher, or sweep the floor.
- # Fold some laundry, put away some laundry.
- # Run an errand for a neighbor.
- ∉# Read a story to a younger brother or sister.
- # Be patient with someone who frustrates or annoys you.
- # Give one of your toys to another child via Saint Vincent de Paul Society or the Salvation Army.

WISDOM'S CORNER

Step into the Light

In the Lithuanian city of Kovno there lived a Jewish professor. Though all his life he had not been a believer, the professor began to be more and more troubled by the sad, neglected condition of the Jewish graveyard in the city. Since the Holocaust against the Jews by the Nazis and the harassment of them by the Communist Russians, no one had taken care of their graves. So, out of the goodness of his heart, the professor himself decided to do so.

Whether or not he was aware that tending graves is a Traditional Good Deed, we do not know. In any case, the good man acquired a spade, a sickle and a pair of shears, and began the job of making the cemetery worthy of those buried in it. At first he was on his own, but as the weeks went by other Jews joined him in the work. Most of these were once observant Jews but had become unbelievers like the professor. Eventually there were some two hundred of them, all doing the true, good thing. As they worked a beautiful thing happened. Their Jewish faith came alive in them. Practically all of them became believers once more.

Anyone who does wrong, hates the light and avoids it, but those who do good love the light and come out into it. How many of our deeds are done in the light? How many of them could bear the scrutiny of the Light?
