

# Not on bread alone

Ethiopia suffered a terrible famine from 1984 to 1986. Cardinal Basil Hume, leader of the Roman Catholics in England, visited the country in the middle of the famine, spending some time in a village in the hills where people were waiting for food that was unlikely to arrive.

Upon his arrival, a little boy befriended him and would not let go of his hand. As he walked around with the child, the little boy kept making two gestures: with one hand he pointed to his mouth, and with the other he took the cardinal's hand and rubbed it on his cheek.

Later the cardinal said, "Here was an orphan boy who was lost and starving, yet by two simple gestures he indicated our two fundamental needs or hungers. With one gesture he showed me his hunger for food, and with the other his hunger for love."

We are indeed fortunate to share in Christ's body and blood, his eternal love of which there is never a famine.

# Francis's deep devotion to the Body & Blood of Christ

Francis's cheerfulness drew its strength from his intimate union with Jesus in the Holy Communion. The mystery of the Holy Eucharist, being an extension of Christ's Agony and Passion, held a primary place in the life of Francis, and he had nothing more at heart than all that concerned devotion to the Blessed Sacrament. Thus, we not only can read words that were written by Francis exhorting priests to show befitting respect for everything connected with the Sacrifice of the Mass, but we also can read of the actions of Francis done to help poverty-stricken churches: he swept them, he obtained sacred vessels for them, and he provided them with altar-breads made by himself. All this was done for Jesus in the Eucharist.

Our Deacon, Brother Joe Mioc, will be ordained a priest Friday, June 6! He and his fellow Franciscan deacon (serving in our New York City parish) will be ordained here in Chicago at Blessed Stepinac church (formerly "Angel Guardian" church — at Ridge and Devon). The ordination Mass begins at 7 p.m. and though it will be in Croatian, it will be beautiful for all to hear, to see and to pray at. All from St. Jerome's are invited to participate. Then, on Sunday, June 15, Joe will celebrate his First Mass at the 11 a.m. Mass at St. Jerome's, with much rejoicing in the School Hall afterward. Come and receive the "New Priest Blessing" at both Masses.
