## WEEKLY MEDITATION — Pentecost Sunday

We naturally want to cling to someone we love and depend on. We often can't bear the thought of that person leaving us. When Jesus told the Apostles that he was leaving them, they were sad. It must have been very hard for them to see how his going away could be for their good.

Loving at times means distancing oneself from the person loved. This means that the person is free to develop in his

own way. He is made to feel he has a contribution to make, and is free to receive from another.

Often however, we hug the limelight. We want to be there all the time. We don't know when or how to withdraw. We might not decrease so that the other might develop and increase.

This may give us some insight into what Jesus meant when he said it was *necessary* for the Apostles that he should go. Besides, until Jesus left, the

Holy Spirit would not be sent.

No one ever showed more confidence in, or respect for people than Jesus. He did not dominate. He handed over his entire work to the Apostles. He knew that they still needed help, and that is why he sent them the Holy Spirit.

We too need the Holy Spirit. We need him to help us realize the power and gifts we have within us so that we too can become witnesses for Christ.

### **One-Minute Catholic Catechism:**

This Pentecost, let's consider the **Seven Gifts** of the Holy Spirit, which are: wisdom, understanding, knowledge, counsel, fortitude, piety and fear of the Lord.

*Each gift perfects one of the 7 basic virtues! Four gifts perfect the four intellectual virtues.*

**Understanding** gives an intuitive penetration into truth known by *faith*. **Wisdom** perfects *charity*, in order to judge divine things. **Knowledge** perfects the virtue of *hope*. The gift of **counsel** perfects *prudence*.

The other three gifts perfect virtues of the will and appetites. The gift of **piety** perfects *justice* in giving to others that which is their due. This is especially true

of giving God what is His due. **Fortitude** perfects the virtue of *fortitude* (surprise!), in facing dangers. **Fear of the Lord** perfects *temperance* in controlling disordered appetites.

Finally, the full and obvious action of these gifts does not appear until one is well advanced in the spiritual life, although fairly hidden assistance by them *can* come earlier.
