WEEKLY MEDITATION — FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

The performance of a *duty* — even the faithful performance of such — can result in a withering of the heart when a person is not motivated by love.

Jesus gives us a good example of this in his parable of the hireling and the Good Shepherd. For the hireling, minding the sheep is just a job. He's in it only for the wages. He doesn't know the sheep or care about them. The sheep suffer as a result. For the Good Shepherd, minding the sheep is not just a job. It is a way of life, a vocation. He knows his sheep and cares about them, to the point that he is prepared to risk his life to save them. The sheep thrive as a result.

What makes the Good Shepherd so different from the hireling is the fact that he loves what he does. He is interested in it and dedicated to it. This doesn't make it any easier, but it enables him to bring all his energies to it. If you love what you do, the energy will be given to you. Not only does the work benefit, but the worker benefits too — it brings out the best in one. To work like this, is to be free.

As Christians we are invited to try to see our work, whatever it happens to be, as a service to others. If we do, then we are being good shepherds. Let your work make your love visible.

Good Shepherd/Vocations Sunday

Are you a young man being called by God to be a Good Shepherd?

What should a young man do if he senses that God maywant **him** to be a **priest**?

This is an extremely appropriate question to consider today on **Vocation Awareness Sunday**: How does a young man become **aware** of a **vocation** (a call) **from God**? God rarely calls people to the priesthood in a loud and obvious manner. God usually calls through whispers to the heart, through the Holy Spirit that has dwelled in each of our hearts since our baptisms. How does a young man *hear* the whisperings and *feel* the inspiration of the Holy Spirit calling *him in particular* to be a priest? PRAY, PRAY, PRAY. And then pray some more.

Use Jesus as a model. Whenever Jesus had a momentous question to resolve (for example, who was God calling to be his 12 Apostles), Jesus went off to be alone and PRAY, PRAY, PRAY. He would sometimes pray all night. In the Garden of Gethsemane, he prayed so hard over the momentous question of whether or not to sacrifice his life on the cross that "his sweat became like drops of blood falling on the ground."

A young man deciding whether God is calling him to be a priest is facing a Garden of Gethsemane question: Whether or not to sacrifice his life on the cross of priesthood. Being a priest means sacrificing having a wife and kids. A tremendous sacrifice. But to someone truly called to be a priest, God will give other tremendous joys — just ask any satisfied priest.

So pray about it. To pray well, you need to **live well**. Live a good and **unselfish** life — loving God with all your heart and your neighbor as yourself. And praying well requires **silence**. Carve out time for prayer away from constant electronic buzz and the buzz of worries. And don't always talk during prayer — **listen** too. Furthermore, a priest will serve **in** the Church, not by himself. So **connect** with a priest or vocation director to see if you have a genuine call to the priesthood. Pray alone, but don't be a unconnected loner. Try to be good, try to be mature (**goodness and maturity** are essential for any calling — priestly or married life). And **be not afraid.** If God wants you to be a priest, a Good Shepherd for his flock, God will speak to your heart and give you strength to follow through.

WISDOM'S CORNER

Good Shepherd Gave His Life

Philip Lawrence was the headmaster at St. George's Catholic School in London, England. On a December day in 1995 he was stabbed outside his school while trying to protect one of his pupils who was being attacked by a gang, and died as a result of his wounds.

He was voted "Personality of the Year" by listeners to a BBC Radio 4's *Today* program. He received thousands more votes than the Prime Minister. Philip's wife said that her husband would probably have been extremely embarrassed by all of that. He was very modest, to the point of being self-deprecating.

It is heartening to know that people still recognize the greatness of an act of self-sacrifice like this. It is also especially inspiring to know that someone can do such an act and look on it as something normal and natural.

Philip Lawrence was a Good Shepherd to his pupils. It was unthinkable for him to allow one of them to be attacked without intervening to help.


