Today's feast day of All Souls should fill us all with the beauty of Christian hope. Death is not a permanent severance; it is only a temporary separation. In the Mass for the Dead this is so well expressed in the words, "Life is changed, not ended."

loved ones and ourselves. In true motherly fashion, the Church takes all who have died and solemnly supplicates for them through the Mass and through prayers.

In this spirit of hope, nurtured by the knowledge that we are still spiritually close, useful, and a consolation to our dead ones, the Church invites us to pour out our prayers for the mercy of God that these souls may enjoy eternal joy.
