The merchants in the Temple and the people served by them were acting in good conscience, so they were shocked at Jesus' reaction. They questioned his right to do what he did and asked for some sign to prove the divine origin of his



mission. Jesus gave them a sign that was incomprehensible to them: he would rise from the dead three days after being put to death. Everything

would be turned upside down, but it was exactly what was predicted, and awaited over the centuries.
