WEEKLY MEDITATION for the 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jesus spotted Zacchaeus in a tree. Because Zacchaeus's lifestyle was in complete opposition to everything Jesus stood for, quite a few people expected that Jesus would admonish the tax collector.

Instead, Jesus did something that made him immediately unpopular with some people. He asked Zacchaeus if

he could dine in his house. Some complained that Jesus had gone to eat at the home of a sinner. They didn't want to see Zacchaeus be treated nice; they wanted to see him condemned.

Jesus offered Zacchaeus salvation, not condemnation. There was no question of whether or not Zacchaeus *deserved* salvation — he didn't do anything to deserve it. Jesus knew that he *needed* it. And Zacchaeus accepted the love of Jesus and thus experienced a true change of heart.

It is only with the heart that we can repent rightly. Repentance must involve a change of heart. Anything less won't produce a new being. It will be like clipping weeds while leaving their roots intact. But if we can change the depths of our hearts, then we will change our lives.

Fear alone can't produce a conversion of heart; only an encounter with love can. Zacchaeus' conversion was a conversion to goodness. All of us stand in daily need of such a conversion.

Come home to Father

In a small town in Spain, a man named Jorge had a bitter, bitter argument with his young son Paco. The next day Jorge discovered that Paco's bed was empty — he had run away from home.

Overcome with remorse, Jorge searched his soul and realized that his son was more important to him than almost anything else. He wanted to start over. Jorge went to a well-known store in the center of town and posted a large sign that read, "Paco, come home. I love you. Meet me here tomorrow morning." It was signed: Your Father.

The next morning Jorge went to the store hoping to see his son. There he found him — and six other young boys named Paco who had also run away from home. They were all answering the call of love, hoping it was their father inviting them home with open arms.

Through the Sacrament of Reconciliation, Our Father offers loving forgiveness with open arms when we turn away from sin and want to come home.

Franciscan Friars: 1209-2009, and beyond...



Continuing our gradual look at the Franciscan Friars as they approach their 800th birthday as a Religious Order, we turn our attention this week to the man who started it all: St. Francis of Assisi.

Who was Francis? In the eyes of many people nowadays, he is the "Birdbath Saint." Our most frequent encounter with his image is atop a birdbath, usually with a stone pigeon on his shoulder. While it is true that he was a lover of animals, this was a relatively minor part of his life story.

At the center of Francis's story was his 20-year struggle to follow in the footsteps of Christ. He struggled to conform himself to Jesus. He lived and breathed the words of the Gospels. And God graciously confirmed that Francis was on the right track by a great miracle: Two years before Francis died, he saw a vision of the Crucified Christ with angelic wings. After the vision, Francis had the wounds of Christ in his hands, feet and side. Through this miracle, God told the world that Francis had truly conformed himself to Jesus.
