#### WEEKLY MEDITATION

#### 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time

The picture that Jesus painted of some of the Pharisees was not a pretty one. He exposed religious pomp and show, together with horrible inconsistencies. What faults did Jesus find in them? They didn't practice what they preached. They imposed many rules and demanded exact observe of them without offering the slightest help to those burdened by those rules. They sought their own glory rather than the

glory of God. They lacked charity and compassion in their dealings with others. Yet, obviously, those Pharisees and Scribes were not a uniquely evil group. They were simply human. They could be any group of people at any time or place. The picture that Jesus painted of them is a mirror into which we too are invited to look. If we do look into it, we will see our own faces there, for all of us have some of their faults.

Many people are sincere and pious like the Pharisees, but do not practice what we preach. Piety is good, but in our humility before the glory of God, we need to become more humble, more loving, and more compassionate. Piety alone is no substitute for goodness.

In the end, the real tragedy for the Pharisees and for us is not that we have faults, but that we are often blind to those faults. Until we look in the mirror.

#### Dear Parishioners,


The month of November is approaching, and soon thereafter comes the end of the year. At year's end we compile and analyze our parish records and plan next year's projects.

Lord, help us to shun all falsity and pretense, and to live a life of genuine goodness. Then our deeds will flow from what we are as naturally as good fruit comes from a good tree. Amen.

# Christian origins of Halloween

In 835 Pope Gregory IV moved the commemoration of martyrs (later All

Saints Day) from May 13 to Nov. 1. The night before became known as All Hallow's Eve or "holy evening," and eventually Halloween. (November 2 became All Souls Day.) Hundreds of years ago in Ireland, farmers prepared for All Saints Day and All Souls Day the night before by going door-to-door collecting food and goods for a village feast and bonfire. Those who contributed were promised prosperity; those who didn't received threats of bad luck. The Irish Catholics who immigrated in the 1800s brought this practice of "trick-or-treating" with them. Halloween can be a good chance to focus on the holy days of All Saints and All Souls as celebrations of the communion of saints. It's a time to remember the believers who have gone to Heaven before us and the hope we have of joining them.
