When Jesus gave his answer in today's Gospel he implied that there need not be conflict between the demands of the State and those of God.

Every Christian has dual citizenship. As citizens of the country in which we are born or living, we are under obligation to the State. The legitimate State has rights, and Christians must respect those rights, laws, and rulers. They must be responsible citizens. Failure to be a good citizen is a failure in Christian duty. But Christians are also citizens of the Kingdom of Heaven. As such they have certain privileges and also obligations.

Every Christian living in the modern world is faced with diffi-

cult decisions. There are so many l i t t l e 'Caesars' vying for a



piece of our conscience, but our first and deepest loyalty is to God. To God alone we render worship.

Allegiance to God

Franz Jaggerstatter was born in Austria and raised a Catholic. He was an ordinary, young man who held a regular job. There was nothing about him to suggest that he had in him the stuff of martyrs. However, at some stage he suddenly matured. He became very responsible and began to take his religion seriously. He married a girl named Anna, and they had three children.

Franz was 36 by the time the WWII was raging. He was drafted into Hitler's army but refused to serve. This was tantamount to suicide. His friends, and eventually his wife, tried to talk him into serving. He simply said, "I cannot join because I believe that this war is not a just war. Therefore, it would be wrong for me to join. It would be against my conscience. I love my people and I love my country, but there's a higher law — God's law. And God's law tells me that this war is wrong."

He was arrested and put into prison where further efforts were made to change his mind. Franz was beheaded on August 9, 1943. He felt he was obeying the words of Christ: "Give to Caesar what belongs to Caesar, and to God what belongs to God."
