WEEKLY MEDITATION — Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's Gospel deals with a very important subject—the exercise of authority. People seek authority for different reasons. Some like the power that goes with it; it makes them feel important. Others like the prestige it brings. Others like the higher salary. All these reasons are opportunities to promote oneself.

When James and John asked Jesus if they could have the top places in

his kingdom, they were likely thinking only of themselves. They did not mind how much envy and resentment they aroused in their companions.

They evidently thought that his kingdom was modeled on worldly standards, but Jesus told them that it wasn't like that at all. In his kingdom, the greatest would be those who were willing to serve others rather than serve themselves. Jesus saw authority as an opportunity to serve. He set the example himself. He would leads, but he does not control. He appeals, and invites, but leaves the response to us. Jesus uses his authority not to control but rather to invite our response to his love.

Those entrusted with power over their fellow human beings ought to be caring, just, merciful, wise, tolerant, lenient, and ready to serve—even to the point of sacrifice and suffering.

From Pope Benedict's lips to our ears:

The Vatican recently issued a question-and-answer format book that teaches the truth about Jesus & the Catholic Church.

Question: What role does Sacred Scripture play in the life of the Church?

Answer: Sacred Scripture give support and vigor to the life of the Church. For the children of the Church, it is a confirmation of the faith, food for the soul and the fount of the spiritual life. Sacred Scripture is the soul of theology and of pastoral preaching. The Psalmist says that it is "a lamp to my feet and a light to my path" (Ps. 119:105). The Church, therefore, exhorts all to read Sacred Scripture frequently because "ignorance of the Scriptures is ignorance of Christ" (St. Jerome).

- to stoop down and consider the needs and desires of little children;
- to remember the weakness and loneliness of people who are growing old;
- to stop asking how much your friends love *you*, and to ask yourself whether you love *them* enough;
- to bear in mind the things that other people have to bear on their hearts:
- to trim your lamp so that it will give more light and less smoke, and to carry it in front so that your shadow will fall behind you;
- to make a grave for your ugly thoughts and a garden for your kindly feelings, with the gate open?

Voting with a Clear Conscience:

10 Easy Steps offered by www.priestsforlife.org

Step #1: Commit to vote this Nov. 7: and pray for wisdom and guidance. Step #2: Know where the candidates stand. Step #3: Reject the Disqualified. Step #4: Distinguish "disagreements over policy" from "breaking fundamental principles." Step #5: Weigh other issues properly because not all issues have equal weight.

Step #6: Keep loyalty focused on Jesus. When we vote, we say something about where our lovalties are. There is nothing wrong with being loyal to a candidate or party. But there is something very wrong if loyalty to either is stronger than loyalty to Jesus Christ. Ask, "Is there a position that my party can take that would prevent me from voting the party line?" Or looking from another angle: "Is my loyalty to the Christian faith stronger than my loyalty to any political party?"

Step #7: Remember, the party in power matters. Voting with a clear conscience also means that you consider how the outcome of the election in which you vote affects the balance of power. In other words, elections do not only put individual candidates into power; they put political parties into power. And it is not only the candidates who have positions. So do the parties.
