WEEKLY MEDITATION for the 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time

The question of which commandment was the greatest was frequently discussed among rabbis of Jesus' time. Jesus was asked to name one greatest commandment, but responded by naming two. That is because, for him, the second followed directly and necessarily from the first. Love of neighbor arises out of love of God. Both commandments are found in the Old Testament.

What is new is not the fact that Je-

sus brought these two commandments together, but that he ranked them together. To separate the two great commandments is a tragedy and goes contrary to the Gospel.

Unfortunately this often happens. Those who have faith sometimes have no love for others, and those who love others, sometimes have no love for God. Jesus didn't say they were the same thing, but



that they are like two sides of one coin. If we want the total Gospel we must have both.

Loving God and neighbor

In the time of the desert monks there was an abbot named Moses who had a great reputation for holiness. Easter was approaching, so the monks decided to fast the entire length of Holy week. Then each monk went off to his cell to fast and pray.

About the middle of the week, two wandering monks came to visit the cell of Abbot Moses. Seeing that they were hungry, he cooked a little vegetable stew for them. To make them feel at ease, he took a little of it himself.

The other monks saw the smoke rising from his cell and new that he had cooked some food. To them this could only mean that he had broken the solemn fast. They were shocked and went over to confront him. In reply to their accusations he said, "I have broken the commandment of men, but in sharing my food with these brothers of ours, I have kept the commandment of God that we should love one another." On hearing this the monks grew silent, and walked away humbled but wiser.
