WEEKLY MEDITATION 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jesus says, "If your brother does something wrong, go and have it out with him alone." He doesn't say, "Put up with it, suffer it, endure it." He says, "Go and confront him with his wrong-doing." If someone is committing a wrong, we have a duty to point it out to him or her. It is a special duty for those in positions of authority. People put up with all kinds of abuse for the sake of a false peace. They may thing that this is the will of God for them. We don't show love for someone if we allow him to do wrong to us. By hurting us he is also damaging himself. It is in his interest, too, that he desist from what he is doing. To confront another person is a difficult thing and calls for courage and wisdom. If we do it in anger and in a vengeful frame of mind, in all probability it will be counter-productive. We have to do it not just out of concern for ourselves and the hurt caused to our pride, but out of concern for the other person. It is a way of showing love for him. Today's Gospel shows that there is another approach. We should gently confront the person who is causing the hurt to try to help him amend his ways and to be reconciled with him. Even if reconciliation proves to be impossible, it must not be left untried. Reconciliation can happen, and when it does it leads to great growth for both parties. When there is a need to confront someone, first pray about it. Prayer disposes one to use Christ's approach, and enables one to respond to it.

The annual school picnic will be held on Labor Day, Sept. 5, at the monastery grounds on Drexel.


